



The Graduation Ceremony



The formal conferring of university degrees goes back to medieval times in Europe, when scrolls, signifying their achievements, were granted to the graduates with great pomp and ceremony, reinforcing their rank, privileges and responsibilities in a highly stratified society. Graduation ceremonies were very rowdy affairs, however, exemplified by the lowering of a large wooden spoon, from the balcony in the Senate House in Cambridge, to the graduate who came bottom of the class in the Mathematics Tripos.

Nowadays such behaviour is frowned upon and the ceremonies have the dignity which befits the occasion. Special ceremonial robes are worn signifying, in the case of degrees, status as a bachelor, master or doctor, and the hoods, derived from medieval dress, signify the discipline or disciplinary group of the degree. A sash rather than a hood, worn over a black gown, signifies a diploma.

Academic Dress



The academic dress adopted by universities of the Commonwealth follows the style of Oxford or Cambridge. Sunway University has adopted the Oxford style which, for bachelors, has a black gown and hood, the hood being lined with satin. The design of the hood helps to distinguish between bachelor and masters but it is the colour of the lining of the hood that signifies the discipline group.

The following colours are used to represent degrees in the respective faculties in Sunway:

Sunway University Business School Royal Fuchsia


The same colours are used in signifying diplomas but, instead of a hood, a sash is worn.

The PhD gown with bell-shaped sleeves is in bright orange with blue and grey trimmings, representing the colours of the University. The front trimming of the gown is embellished with the University's Coat of Arms and it is worn with a soft-crowned round-brimmed bonnet.

Honorary Doctorate Recipient

Emeritus Professor Wang Gungwu, CBE

The award of the Doctor of Letters *Honoris Causa* (D.Litt *Sunway hc*): For contributions to the development of higher education in Malaysia



Professor Wang Gungwu is a prominent scholar and historian on Asia. He is University Professor, Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences, National University of Singapore (NUS), Emeritus Professor of the Australian National University, Canberra, and is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Jeffrey Cheah Foundation.

He was born in Indonesia and grew up in Ipoh in the then British Malaya. He lived under the Dutch and British colonial administration, the Japanese occupation, and the newly independent countries of Malaysia and Singapore. Professor Wang received his BA (Hons) and MA degrees from the University of Malaya in Singapore, and his PhD from the University of London (1957). His teaching career took him from the University of Malaya (Singapore and Kuala Lumpur, 1957-1968, Professor of History 1963-68) to The Australian National University (1968-1986), where he was Professor and Head of the Department of Far Eastern History and Director of the Research School of Pacific and Asian Studies. From 1986 to 1995, he was Vice-Chancellor of the University of Hong Kong. He was Director of the East Asian Institute of NUS from 1997 to 2007.

Professor Wang is a Commander of the British Empire (CBE); Fellow, and former President, of the Australian Academy of the Humanities; Foreign Honorary Member of the American Academy of Arts and Science; Member of Academia Sinica, Taipei; Honorary Research Fellow of the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences, Beijing. In 1994, Professor Wang was awarded the Fukuoka Asian Culture Prize by the city of Fukuoka in Japan. In Singapore, he is Chairman of the East Asian Institute and the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy at NUS; Chairman, Board of Trustees, Institute of Southeast Asian Studies; Member, Board of Governors, The S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies and the Chinese Heritage Centre, Nanyang Technological University.

He is also a member of the Editorial Board or Advisory Editor of various international journals, which include the *Journal of Southeast Asian Studies, The China Journal, Modern Asian Studies, The Japanese Journal of Political Science, China Studies, Pacific Affairs, The Journal of Chinese Overseas, Contemporary Southeast Asia, and Journal of the Malaysian Branch of the Royal Asiatic Society.*

Professor Wang has studied and written on the history and civilisation of China and Southeast Asia and on the history of the Chinese diaspora in Southeast Asia. His books include *The Nanhai Trade: The Early History of Chinese Trade in the South China Sea*, new edition (1998); *The Chinese Overseas: From Earthbound China to the Quest for Autonomy* (2000); *Anglo-Chinese Encounters Since* 1800: *War, Trade, Science and Governance* (2003); *Divided China: Preparing for reunification,* 883-947 (2007); *Renewal: The Chinese State and the New Global History* (2013); and *Another China Cycle: Committing to Reform* (2014).

In recognition of his distinction as one of the pre-eminent historians of Southeast Asia, for his outstanding service as a distinguished scholar and university administrator, and for his contribution to the development of higher education in Malaysia as an advisor and trustee of the Jeffrey Cheah Foundation (JCF), Sunway University is proud to award Professor Wang Gangwu this Honorary Doctorate.

The Coat of Arms

Responsibility for the granting of Coats of Arms has rested with the College of Arms in London since AD1484. Applicants are considered by the Garter King of Arms, and if he deems the individual, family or organisation to be worthy of this distinction then the Arms are duly granted. Registers are maintained to ensure that new designs are unique and that existing designs are protected.

In 2005, the Board of Sunway University (formerly Sunway University College) resolved to seek Arms from the College of Arms, and in May 2006, a grant of Arms to Sunway was approved.

The main elements of a Coat of Arms are the crest and the shield. Mottoes do not form a part of a grant of arms, but most grantees choose a succinct statement which represents individual or organisational statements of purpose or values.

The Sunway University *shield* contains three geometric shapes known as "piles", each "charged" with a golden sun. Together, the piles form a "W" and, with the suns, the device suggests the name Sunway. The stylized suns have a slight resemblance to the star on a blue background that appears on the Malaysian flag.

The *crest* is more obviously symbolic of Malaysia, consisting, as it does, of a Malaysian tiger. It is shown holding a torch, often used in heraldry to symbolize learning and teaching.

Our motto "Fortuna Eruditis Favet" derives from Louis Pasteur's famous phrase "la chance ne sourit qu'aux esprits bien preparés". Pasteur, commenting in 1855 on Oersted's "chance" discovery of electromagnetism, expressed the view that chance discoveries take place only in the context of a prepared mind. We have adapted the phrase to read "Fortune Favours the Prepared Mind" and this was translated into Latin by Professor Thomas N Mitchell, Provost and Professor of Latin at Trinity College Dublin.



The Mace

In the medieval Europe, the mace was a weapon carried into battle by knights and warlike bishops, reflecting their status and prowess in the field. In the university context, it was carried as a weapon to protect the Chancellor, but it has now evolved into a purely ceremonial device signifying the dignity and authority of the Chancellor.

Designed by Royal Selangor Pewter Sdn Bhd, the Mace is 4.5ft in length. It is made of pewter in bright finish and its interior is supported by teakwood. Relevant parts are highlighted with 24-carat gold plating. The head of the Mace is a shining sun in gold plate and, directly underneath, the University's Coat of Arms is hand chased in relief on 925 sterling silver. The progressive "S" and hibiscus flower motifs, also hand chased on silver and gold, represent the parentage of Sunway University, and the identity of Malaysia respectively. A crystal stone is set at the beginning of the name of the institution to mark the front section of the Mace.

The Mace rests on a nyatoh wood base in mahogany finish to complement the Chancellor's Chair.

The Chancellor's Chair

The Chancellor's Chair is made of solid nyatoh wood, and finished in satin mahogany lacquer. The seat, backrest and armrests are wrapped with natural rich brown leather from Germany.

The Coat of Arms of the University, in a highly sculptured relief on a finely textured background, and cast in pewter with gold plating, is placed at the apex of the backrest. The apex itself is modelled on the upper part of the portico of the then Sunway University building.





Sunway University has its origins in Sunway College, founded by Y.Bhg. Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Jeffrey Cheah, Ao, in 1986 to provide opportunities for young Malaysians to obtain higher education and training at the certificate, diploma and degree levels, especially in areas of national need. The first intake of students in 1987 numbered about 200, enrolled in degree studies leading to bachelor degrees from a number of foreign universities. These courses were delivered through the 'twinning' arrangements, pioneered by Sunway College, whereby students spent one or two years in Sunway and then transferred to the foreign university to complete their degrees. Degree programmes of Western Michigan University (WMU) in the US were the first to be introduced and these were followed by twinning arrangements with a number of UK and Australian universities. In the late 1990s, 3+0 degree programmes were approved by the Malaysian Government and Sunway College was able to offer the business degrees of Victoria University, Australia, entirely in Malaysia while continuing the 2+2 programmes with WMU.

In addition, the Malaysian Government sanctioned the establishment of branch campuses of foreign universities and Sunway again took the initiative. In a historic agreement with Monash University, Australia, the first branch campus of a foreign university was established at the Sunway campus in 1998. In July 2007, Monash University Sunway campus moved to a magnificent new campus at Jalan Lagoon Selatan, Bandar Sunway. It is currently offering a full range of undergraduate degrees, including medicine through its Jeffrey Cheah School of Medicine and Health Sciences, which was established in 2005.

In 2004, Sunway College was elevated to the status of a University College, by the then Minister of Higher Education YB Dato' Dr Shafie Mohd Salleh, with the power to grant degrees.

With foresight, this was immediately followed by discussions with a top international university to further value-add to the degrees offered at Sunway University College. In 2006, a UK-based university and ranked in the top 1% of universities in the world, Lancaster University, officially sealed a partnership agreement with Sunway to validate most of Sunway's degrees.

After consistently providing high quality standard education, Sunway received its university upgrade in December 2010. The programmes leading to degrees at Sunway University are approved by the Ministry of Higher Education and the Malaysian Qualifications Agency (MQA). The University has been achieving Excellent ratings in the official rating system of all universities and university colleges in Malaysia, the SETARA 2009, SETARA 2011 and SETARA 2013 by the MQA. Sunway University was officially registered in January 2011 and came into being with the vision of becoming a world-class university.

Sunway University currently has a student population of over 6,000. It is a veritable global community on campus as over 15% of its total student number is international, coming from over 70 countries. Sunway University moved to a brand new purpose-built state-of-the-art building in 2015.

In 2015, Sunway University submitted for its first ever rating by an international organisation obtaining a remarkable four star overall rating from QS, with the highest five star ratings for teaching, employability, and facilities putting the University on par with many leading international universities.

The University has also been receiving outstanding results in the i-Graduate International Student Barometer Survey, being rated by students as No.1 in Asia for employability for two consecutive years – 2014 and 2015.



Jeffrey Cheah Foundation





The fundamental premise of the Jeffrey Cheah Foundation (JCF) is giving to society, a philosophy that has governed its predecessor, the former Sunway Education Trust Fund since its inception in 1997.

With this special purpose non-profit vehicle, the JCF currently owns and governs 16 educational institutions making up the Sunway Education Group which include Sunway University, Sunway College, Monash University Malaysia, Sunway International School and the Jeffrey Cheah School of Medicine and Health Sciences. JCF is today the largest education-focused social enterprise in Malaysia.

As a result of its well-thought out corporate structure and status as a registered charity, the Foundation is able to continue in perpetuity Tan Sri Dr Jeffrey Cheah's vision and legacy of giving; while at the same time serving as a catalyst and as a vehicle for others to contribute to the shared cause of education.

Through the Foundation, operating surpluses are ploughed back into the institutions for expansion of faculty and facilities, and disbursed as scholarships and research grants, ensuring that education and development programmes of the highest quality are supported and sustained.

Governed by a distinguished Board of Trustees, the Foundation aims to safeguard the institutions under its care for the purpose of providing affordable education at the highest level, including knowledge transfer to those from disadvantaged backgrounds. There is thus a means, through scholarships, for the present and future generations of deserving students to succeed. To date, more than RM270 million in scholarships have been awarded to thousands of deserving students in various fields of study in Malaysia and overseas including the Universities of Cambridge and Oxford.

In 2013, the Jeffrey Cheah Foundation and Harvard University signed agreements to establish at Harvard, two Jeffrey Cheah Professorships on Southeast Asia Studies i.e. the Jeffrey Cheah Professorial Fellow and the Jeffrey Cheah Visiting Professor; and the Jeffrey Cheah Travel Grants following a generous gift by the Jeffrey Cheah Foundation. In conjunction with the contribution, the Jeffrey Cheah Institute on Southeast Asia (JCI) has been set-up at Sunway University to facilitate and support education exchange opportunities between Sunway Education Group and Harvard University.

In 2014 and 2015, historic agreements were signed with the University of Cambridge and the University of Oxford, England. With benefaction by the JCF, the agreements led to the appointment of two Jeffrey Cheah Professorial Fellows respectively in Gonville & Caius College, University of Cambridge, and Brasenose College, University of Oxford.

In April 2016, Tan Sri Dr Jeffrey Cheah, Ao, Founding Trustee of the JCF, presented a gift of USD10 million to the United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network Association (SDSN) establishing a strategic collaboration in setting up the Jeffrey Sachs Center on Sustainable Development at Sunway University. The pioneering Center will offer some of the world's best curriculum, academic and executive programmes on sustainable development. Tan Sri Dr Jeffrey Cheah, Ao believes this is an important step in the right direction, to develop the global expertise needed to move Malaysia and Asia forward in the area of sustainable development.

Early in 2005, Sunway and Lancaster University in the UK commenced discussions on how the two institutions might co-operate and, in the course of these discussions, which extended over one year, the concept of dual degrees was explored. Lancaster conducted an institutional review in March 2006, which involved a site visit by senior academics from the University and a senior academic from the University of Sussex. As a result, in September 2006, Lancaster approved the signing of an affiliation agreement between the two institutions. The agreement provides for the validation of relevant Sunway degrees . by the Senate of Lancaster University following site visits by course consultants and lengthy panel discussions by video conference. Sunway University students who successfully complete an honours degree programme are now awarded both Sunway and Lancaster degrees, with separate scrolls from each institution.

Lancaster University is one of Britain's best research and teaching universities. Its growing reputation is reflected by top ten rankings in each of the UK's major university league tables, including ninth in the Complete University Guide and the Times/Sunday Times; and eighth in the Guardian.

Lancaster is in the Top 1% of universities globally and 83% of research is internationally excellent and world-leading, measured by the 2014 Research Excellence Framework which assesses the quality and impact of research.

91% of students at Lancaster University are satisfied with their programme and the University is frequently singled out for its high levels of graduate employment; 82% of graduates are in graduate level work or further study.

In Sunway University, which has the power to award its own degrees, it is important to be able to satisfy ourselves, our students, and their parents, that the degree programmes that we offer are of the highest international standard. We are pleased that we have been able to satisfy the very stringent criteria that have been set by Lancaster University in its institutional review and the validation of our degrees. We continue to look forward to delivering our degree programmes in the knowledge that they have been validated by a world class British university in accordance with its own quality assurance protocols and those of the UK Quality Assurance Agency.
