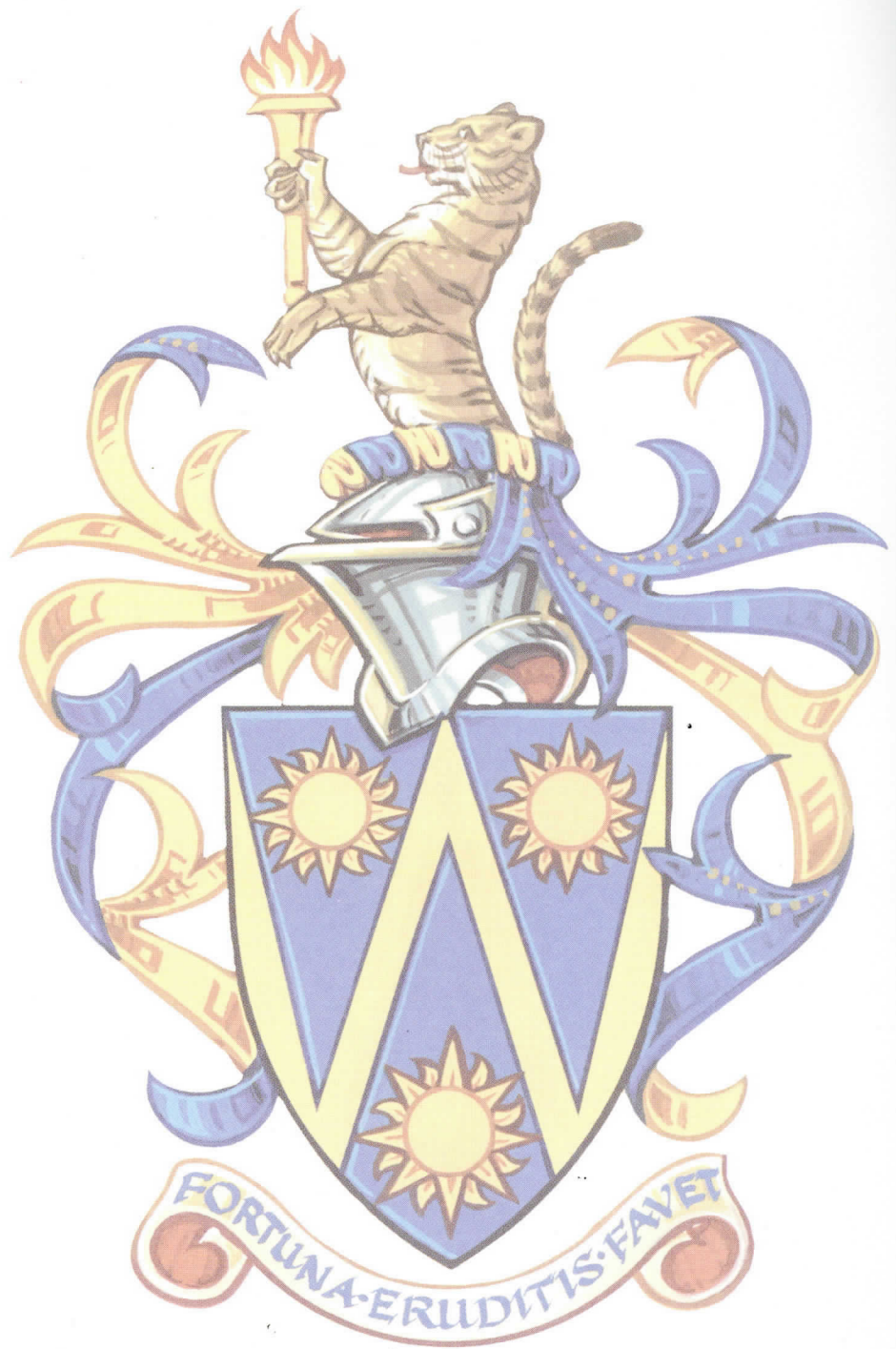

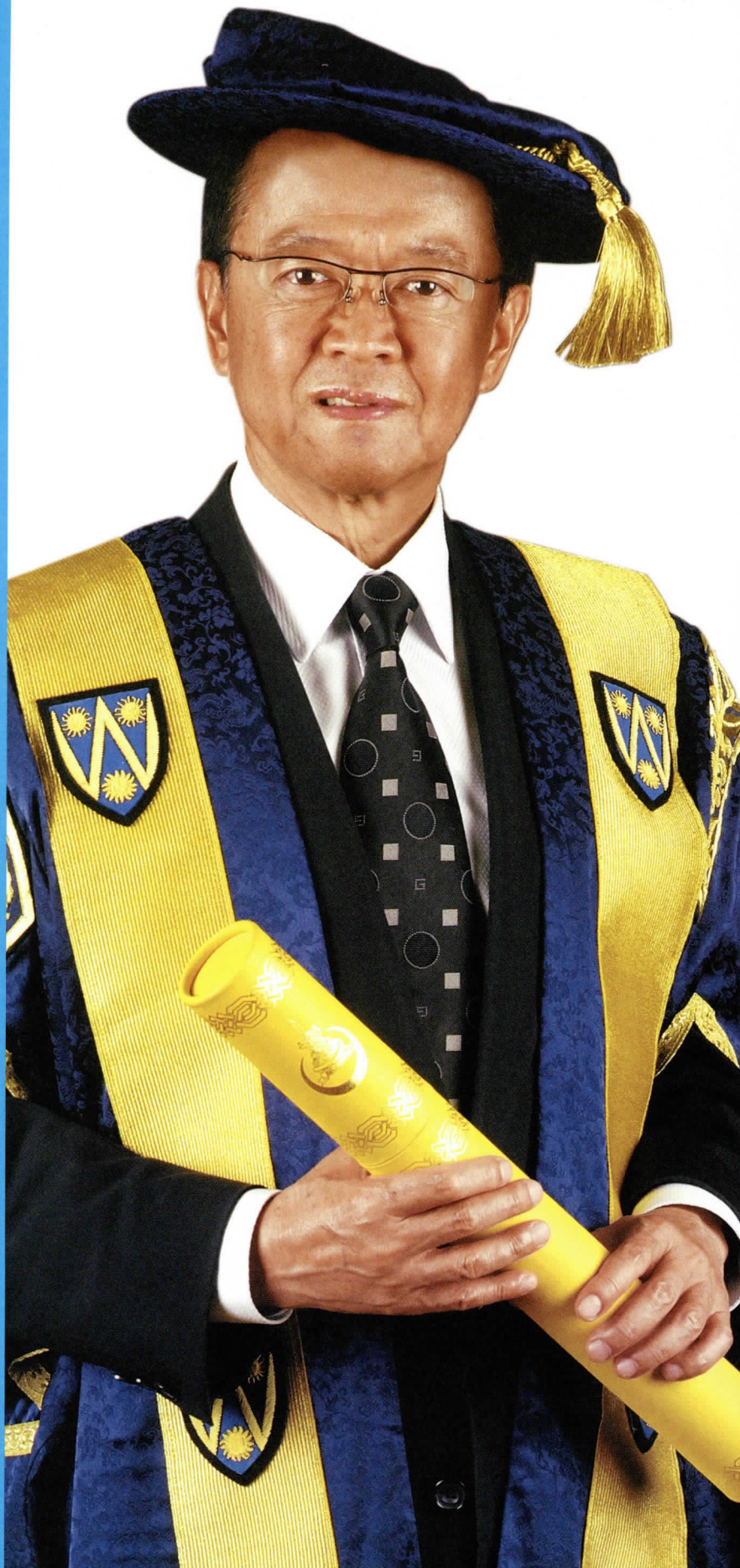

profit. Take this great pride with you in your journey onwards as future leaders in our society. You are now our ambassadors for the quality that keeps our Sunway University College flag flying high.

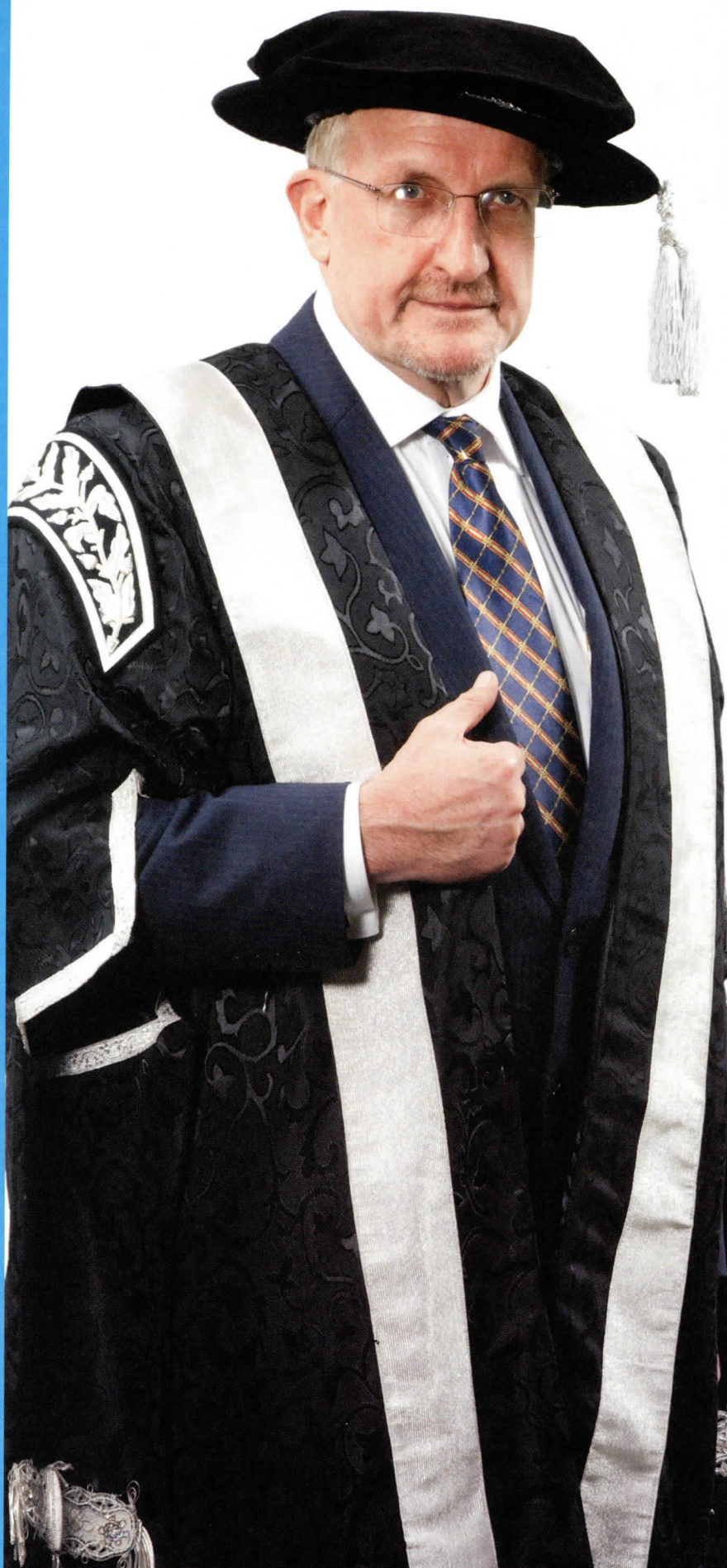

## Message From The Vice-Chancellor

It is my great pleasure to congratulate the graduates who are being presented today to our Chancellor. Your achievements are yours alone, but others have contributed to your success and must share in your joy. Your families have worked hard to support you during your studies, and your lecturers have given you the encouragement and guidance that has enabled you to excel.

When our Chancellor, Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr. Jeffrey Cheah, founded an institution called Sunway College in 1986, his vision was that it would provide quality education at an affordable cost to young Malaysians who might otherwise have missed the opportunity for such advancement. Following an affiliation agreement which was signed with Lancaster University in 2006 and through stringent quality assurance procedures, our degrees conform to the high standards of a first class British university and thus to those of the United Kingdom Quality Assurance Agency, as well as those of the Malaysian Qualifications Agency. As a testament to the international standard that they have achieved, the graduates of these validated programmes receive a degree scroll from Sunway together with a degree scroll from Lancaster. This is the third graduation ceremony at which these joint degrees are being awarded.

We are honoured today by the presence of the Chancellor of Lancaster University, Sir Christian Bonington.

He will be presenting Lancaster University scrolls to those graduates who are eligible to receive them.

Earlier this year the Ministry of Higher Education published the outcome of SETARA 2009, its rating exercise for Malaysian higher education institutions. The high standard of teaching and learning at Sunway University College is reflected in our Tier 5 rating, which places us along side the very best universities in the country and confirms the value of the degrees and diplomas that are being awarded today.

For those graduates who are starting your careers, I hope that you will take pride in being an alumnus of Sunway University College and keep in touch through the Sunway Alumni. In this rapidly changing world you will find it necessary to keep up to date by further training and development. Life-long learning has become a necessity rather than a luxury. # The Graduation Ceremony

The formal conferring of university degrees goes back to medieval times in the Europe, when scrolls, signifying their achievements, were granted to the graduates with great pomp and ceremony, reinforcing their rank, privileges and responsibilities in a highly stratified society. Graduation ceremonies were very rowdy affairs, however, exemplified by the lowering of a large wooden spoon, from the balcony in the Senate House in Cambridge, to the graduate who came bottom of the class in the Mathematics Tripos.

Nowadays such behaviour is frowned upon and the ceremonies have the dignity which befits the occasion. Special ceremonial robes are worn signifying, in the case of degrees, status as a bachelor, master or doctor, and the hoods, derived from medieval dress, signify the discipline or disciplinary group of the degree. A sash rather than a hood, worn over a black gown, signifies a diploma.



# Academic Dress

The academic dress adopted by universities of the Commonwealth follows the style of Oxford or Cambridge. Sunway University College has adopted the Oxford style which, for bachelors, has a black gown and hood, the hood being lined with satin. The gown helps to distinguish between bachelors and masters but it is the colour of the lining of the hood that signifies the discipline group. The following colours are used to represent degrees in the respective Schools in Sunway:

## **School of Business**

- Royal Fuchsia

## **School of Computer Technology**

- Mauve

## **School of Creative Arts and Communication**

- Navy Blue

## **School of Health and Natural Sciences**

- Spring Green

## **School of Hospitality, Tourism and Leisure Management**

- Silver

The same colours are used in signifying diplomas but, instead of a hood, a sash is worn.

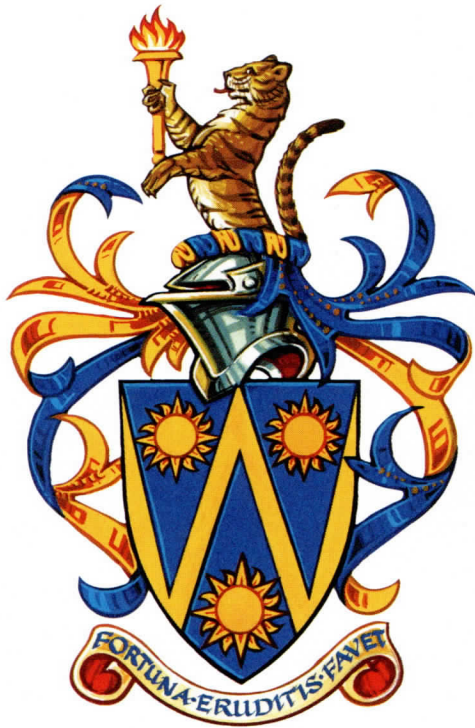

# The Coat of Arms

Responsibility for the granting of Coats of Arms has rested with the College of Arms in London since AD1484. Applicants are considered by the Garter King of Arms, and if he deems the individual, family or organisation to be a worthy of this distinction then the Arms are duly granted. Registers are maintained to ensure that new designs are unique and that existing designs are protected.

In 2005 the Board of Sunway University College resolved to seek Arms from the College of Arms, and in May 2006, a grant of Arms to Sunway University College was approved.

The main elements of a Coat of Arms are the crest and the shield. Mottoes do not form a part of a grant of arms, but most grantees choose a succinct statement which represents individual or organisational statements of purpose or values.

The Sunway University College shield contains three geometric shapes known as "piles", each "charged" with a golden sun. Together, the piles form a "W" and, with the suns, the device suggests the name Sunway. The stylised suns have a slight resemblance to the star, on a blue background, that appears on the Malaysian flag.

The crest is more obviously symbolic of Malaysia, consisting, as it does, of a Malaysian tiger. It is shown holding a torch, often used in heraldry to symbolise learning and teaching.

Our motto "*Fortuna Eruditis Favet*" derives from Louis Pasteur's famous phrase "*la chance ne sourit qu'aux esprits bien préparés*". Pasteur, commenting in 1855 on Oersted's "*chance*" discovery of electromagnetism, expressed the view that chance discoveries take place only in the context of a prepared mind. We have adapted the phrase to read "Fortune Favours The Prepared Mind" and this was translated into Latin by Professor Thomas N Mitchell, Provost and Professor of Latin at Trinity College Dublin.





# The Mace

In the medieval Europe, the mace was a weapon carried into battle by knights and warlike bishops, reflecting their status and prowess in the field. In the university context, it was carried as a weapon to protect the Chancellor, but it has now evolved into a purely ceremonial device signifying the dignity and authority of the Chancellor.

Designed by Royal Selangor Pewter Sdn Bhd, the Mace is 4.5ft in length. It is made of pewter in bright finish and its interior is supported by teakwood. Relevant parts are highlighted with 24-carat gold plating.

The head of the Mace is a shining sun in gold plate and, directly underneath, the University's Coat of Arms is hand chased in relief on 925 sterling silver. The Sunway progressive "S" and hibiscus flower, also hand chased on silver and gold, represent the parentage of Sunway University College, and the identity of Malaysia respectively. A crystal stone is set at the beginning of the name Sunway University College to mark the front section of the Mace.

The Mace rests on a nyatoh wood base in mahogany finish to complement the Chancellor's Chair.





## The Chancellor's Chair

The Chancellor's chair is made of solid nyatoh wood, and finished in satin mahogany lacquer. The seat, backrest and armrests are wrapped with natural rich brown leather from Germany.

The Coat of Arms of the University, in a highly sculptured relief on a finely textured background, and cast in pewter with gold plating, is placed at the apex of the backrest. The apex itself is modelled on the upper part of the portico of the Sunway University College building.





## SUNWAY UNIVERSITY COLLEGE

Sunway University College has its origins in Sunway College, founded by Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr. Jeffrey Cheah in 1986 to provide opportunities for young Malaysians to obtain higher education and training at the certificate, diploma and degree levels, especially in areas of national need. The first intake of students in 1987 numbered about 200, enrolled in degree studies leading to bachelor degrees from a number of foreign universities. These courses were delivered through the 'twinning' arrangements, pioneered by Sunway College, whereby students spent one or two years in Sunway and then transferred to the foreign university to complete their degrees. Degree programmes of Western Michigan University (WMU) in the US were the first to be introduced and these were followed by twinning arrangements with a number of UK and Australian universities. In the late 1990s 3+0 degree programmes were approved by the Malaysian Government and Sunway College was able to offer the business degrees of Victoria University, Australia, entirely in Malaysia while continuing the 2+2 programmes with WMU.

In addition, the Malaysian Government sanctioned the establishment of branch campuses of foreign universities and Sunway again took the initiative. In an historic agreement with Monash University, Australia, the first branch campus of a foreign university was established at the Sunway campus in 1998. In July 2007, Monash University Sunway Campus moved to a magnificent new campus at Jalan Lagoon Selatan, Bandar Sunway. It is currently offering a full range of undergraduate degrees, including medicine through its Jeffrey Cheah School of Medicine, which was established in 2005.

In 2004 Sunway College was elevated to the status of a University College, by the then Minister of Higher Education Y.B. Dato' Dr. Shafie Mohd Salleh, with the power to grant degrees. The courses leading to these degrees are approved by the Ministry of Higher Education and the Malaysian Qualifications Agency (MQA). Sunway University College came into being with the vision of becoming the premier private higher education institution in the ASEAN region.

Sunway University College currently has a student population of 10,000. It is a veritable global community on campus as around 30% of its total student number is international, coming from over 70 countries.



# Jeffrey Cheah Foundation

*Nurturing the seeds of wisdom*



The Jeffrey Cheah Foundation is founded on the fundamental premise of giving to society, a philosophy that has governed the former Sunway Education Trust Fund since its inception in 1997.

With the advent of this special purpose vehicle, four main education institutions are transferred to the Foundation; namely Sunway University College, Monash University Sunway Campus, Sunway International School and the Jeffrey Cheah School of Medicine.

As a result of its special corporate structure, the Foundation is able to continue in perpetuity Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr. Jeffrey Cheah's vision and legacy of giving; and in time become the catalyst for others to contribute to the shared cause of education.

Be it through the Trust Fund or now the Foundation, operating surpluses are ploughed back into the academic institutions or disbursed as scholarships and research grants, ensuring that sustainable quality education is a priority.

Governed by a distinguished board of trustees, the Foundation aims to safeguard the institutions under its care for the purpose of providing a good education at the highest level for those that come from disadvantaged backgrounds. There should be a means, through scholarships, for the present and future generations of deserving students to succeed. To date, more than RM55 million in scholarships have been awarded to thousands of Malaysian students in various fields of study.

This unique structure is a first-of-its-kind in Malaysia for private education institutions, modelled after some of the oldest and most eminent universities in the world.



Early in 2005, Sunway University College and Lancaster University in the UK commenced discussions on how the two institutions might co-operate and, in the course of these discussions, which extended over one year, the concept of joint degrees was explored. Lancaster conducted an institutional review in March 2006, which involved a site visit by senior academics from the University and a senior academic from the University of Sussex. As a result, in September 2006, Lancaster approved the signing of an affiliation agreement between the two institutions. The agreement provides for the validation of all Sunway University College degrees by the Senate of Lancaster University following site visits by course consultants and lengthy panel discussions by video conference. Sunway University College students who successfully complete an honours degree course are now awarded both Sunway and Lancaster degrees, with separate scrolls from each institution.

Lancaster University, founded in 1964, is one of Britain's best research and teaching universities. The Financial Times 2010 Top 100 Global MBA ranked the Lancaster MBA 24th in the world and 4th in the UK. This position confirms the consistent and reliable quality of education provided at Lancaster University, which has stayed in the top 30 places in the world over the last four years. The Guardian ranked Lancaster University in the Top 6 UK Universities this year.

At Sunway University College, which now has the power to award its own degrees, it is important to be able to satisfy ourselves, our students, and their parents, that the degree courses that we offer are of the highest international standard. We are pleased that we have been able to satisfy the very stringent criteria that have been set by Lancaster University in its institutional review and the validation of our degrees. We continue to look forward to delivering our degree programmes in the knowledge that they have been validated by a first class British university in accordance with its own quality assurance protocols and those of the UK Quality Assurance Agency.



## Postgraduate Programmes

In 2009 Sunway University College introduced new masters programmes. These courses have been developed jointly with Lancaster University and lead to the award of joint Sunway and Lancaster degrees. These graduate degrees have been approved by the Ministry of Higher Education and the Malaysian Qualifications Agency (MQA).

Three of these masters degrees were developed with the renowned Lancaster University Management School (LUMS). LUMS is one of the top five management schools in the UK and it has been given a six-star rating by the UK Quality Assurance Agency, one of only two to receive this grade. The other masters degrees have been developed in collaboration with Lancaster's distinguished departments of Computing and Communication Systems.

Since 2005 Sunway University College has also been successfully offering a twinning MBA programme with Victoria University, Australia.
