## Sunway College Johor Bahru introduces a new facility - Healthcare Learning Hub

Sunway College Johor Bahru launched a new facility, the Healthcare Learning Hub (HLH) during the recent campus Open Day held on 15 July 2023. The launch was officiated by Principal, Mrs Hor Poh Choo and Deputy Principal Ms Ong Mei Mei in the presence of representatives from Jabatan Kesihatan Negeri Johor (Johor State Health Department), adding to the importance and significance of the occasion. The concept of the HLH was initiated to enhance the learning experience and provide hands-on training opportunities for students enrolled in the Diploma in Healthcare Management programme. This presents a significant step forward in preparing students for their future careers in the healthcare industry.

"The demand for healthcare services is expected to continuously rise, including in Malaysia and Singapore. This is due to projected demographic shifts, among which are the increase in ageing population, life expectancy and lifestyle diseases. It is important to equip our students with the necessary skills and practical exposure to meet these evolving healthcare needs allowing students to gain some hands-on practice," explained head of programme, Dr Hong Koh Yiin.

The Diploma in Health Care Management (DHCM) programme was introduced in 2019 to meet this growing trend. The comprehensive curriculum is designed to equip graduates with a strong foundation in healthcare management principles, ethics and practices, enabling them to contribute to the improvement of services within the industry.

To further this effort, the HLH was conceived to serve as a dynamic platform for students' academic and professional growth and is established for the following purposes:

## Platform for Industrial Engagement and Collaboration

HLH will serve as the platform for industrial engagement and collaboration. Through interactive forums, engaging seminars, insightful workshops and dynamic networking events, students can connect with members from the extended industry and healthcare professionals. Such interaction is hoped to foster enthusiasm and deepen their understanding of the healthcare industry, setting the stage for future career success within the relevant sector.

#### Simulated Healthcare Facility

HLH is designed for experiential learning by closely replicating relevant sections of real-world healthcare facilities, providing an opportunity for students to improve their practical abilities. Through role-play in simulated scenarios, students acquire the critical thinking, problem-solving and interpersonal skills necessary to excel in their studies and at the future workplace.

#### **One Stop Community Centre**

The HLH is poised to extend its impact beyond the confines of the campus. In time, the college hopes to transform the facility into a 'One Stop Community Centre' which can promote and encourage the adoption of a healthy lifestyle among the local community through organising health-related activities, educational workshops and community outreach programmes with the HLH serving as the coordinating hub and venue of such activity.

In short, the Healthcare Learning Hub at Sunway College Johor Bahru presents a new learning facility for students intended to complement the Diploma in Healthcare Management programme. With the introduction of this innovative approach, the college reaffirms its commitment to delivering highquality education that prepares graduates for the ever-evolving industry.

# Empowering Engineering Students: "Meet The Engineer" Career Talk And Nxp Malaysia Visit At Ausmat, Sunway College KL

In an effort to provide comprehensive industry exposure and career guidance to its AUSMAT general engineering studies (GTEST) students, Sunway College recently organised a series of events that included a career talk and a plant visit. These two initiatives offered students a unique opportunity to gain practical insights into the world of engineering and semiconductor manufacturing.

The career talk featured Andrew Soh, a design engineer from Lattice Semiconductor, Penang. Andrew shared his valuable expertise and experiences, providing students with a glimpse into the intricacies of the engineering field. He spoke about his day-to-day responsibilities at Lattice Semiconductor, which primarily involve creating system-level tests to validate the performance of various high-speed IP programmed into FPGA hardware. AUSMAT students were captivated by his insights into the importance of continuous learning, expectations within the industry, salary prospects, and potential career advancement paths.

Following the career talk, the AUSMAT engineering studies students embarked on an enlightening visit to the NXP Malaysia. The visit began with an introduction to NXP's rich history and its commitment to innovation. Students were able to witness first hand the manufacturing processes behind the semiconductors that power our everyday devices. Guided by knowledgeable professionals, they explored the failure analysis lab, where an electron microscope was in action, revealing the intricate world of semiconductor defect analysis. They then ventured onto the plant floor, observing the assembly and testing processes of electronics. The tour concluded with an overview of the production flow, highlighting the stringent quality control measures implemented by NXP.

By organising events that expose AUSMAT students to industry professionals and real-world experiences, Sunway College equips its AUSMAT graduates with the knowledge, skills, and motivation necessary to excel in their chosen fields.





Cambridge A-Level alumna cum professional Malaysian squash player Wong Heng Wai from Kedah, received a spot to pursue her degree studies as a student athlete from Yale University, Class of 2028, and joining the Yale Squash Team is a dream come true for the squash enthusiast who wish to join the Ivy League and College Squash Association in the United States.

It all started when Heng Wai took part in the Kedah Squash Racket Association selection in Standard 1, and with support from her teachers and family members, Heng Wai has been working hard towards the goals she wants to achieve as a student-athlete.



Heng Wai received the women singles title at the Professional Squash Association (PSA) World Squash Federation (WSF) Satellite Tour in early 2023. She also won the girls' Under-17 title at the US Junior Open Squash Championships in 2019. She currently ranks at #145\* in the PSA World Tour ranking.

While athlete training takes up six days a week, it is difficult to juggle between studies and squash training. Heng Wai's personal tip to balance between both is to always plan a schedule and list down the tasks and goals she will need to accomplish on a weekly/monthly basis.

With advice from her seniors studied in the United States, Heng Wai decided to pursue the worldwide recognised Cambridge A-Level studies and Sunway College is at a strategic location where she can also go for training with the national squash team at Bukit Jalil.

"The lecturers are very supportive and thoughtful, where they understand that I am a student athlete and they will help me to catch up on the syllabus that I have missed. I am also grateful for a bunch of friends I have meet in the programme where we share similar goals and work towards to achieving them," shared Heng Wai.

Heng Wai is currently taking a gap year to focus on her sports career as a full-time athlete where she continues to train, gain experience from elite players while she represents Malaysia to compete in professional tournaments.
