


Be proud of what you have achieved and remember those who have supported you along the way. I wish you every success as you enter the next exciting stage of your life.

THE GRADUATION CEREMONY

The formal conferring of university degrees goes back to medieval times in Europe, when scrolls, signifying their achievements, were granted to the graduates with great pomp and ceremony, reinforcing their rank, privileges and responsibilities in a highly stratified society. Graduation ceremonies were very rowdy affairs, however, exemplified by the lowering of a large wooden spoon, from the balcony in the Senate House in Cambridge, to the graduate who came bottom of the class in the Mathematics Tripos.

Nowadays such behaviour is frowned upon and the ceremonies have the dignity which befits the occasion. Special ceremonial robes are worn signifying, in the case of degrees, status as a bachelor, master or doctor, and the hoods, derived from medieval dress, signify the discipline or disciplinary group of the degree. A sash rather than a hood, worn over a black gown, signifies a diploma. The academic dress adopted by universities of the Commonwealth follows the style of Oxford or Cambridge. Sunway University has adopted the Oxford style which, for bachelors, has a black gown and hood, the hood being lined with satin. The design of the hoods helps to distinguish between bachelors and masters but it is the colour of the lining of the hood that signifies the discipline group. The following colours are used to represent degrees in the respective faculties in Sunway:



THE COAT OF ARMS

Responsibility for the granting of Coats of Arms has rested with the College of Arms in London since AD1484. Applicants are considered by the Garter King of Arms, and if he deems the individual, family or organisation to be worthy of this distinction then the Arms are duly granted. Registers are maintained to ensure that new designs are unique and that existing designs are protected.

In 2005 the Board of Sunway University (formerly Sunway University College) resolved to seek Arms from the College of Arms, and in May 2006, a grant of Arms to Sunway was approved.

The main elements of a Coat of Arms are the crest and the shield. Mottoes do not form a part of a grant of arms, but most grantees choose a succinct statement which represents individual or organisational statements of purpose or values.

The Sunway University shield contains three geometric shapes known as "piles", each "charged" with a golden sun. Together, the piles form a "W" and, with the suns, the device suggests the name Sunway. The stylized suns have a slight resemblance to the star on a blue background that appears on the Malaysian flag.

The crest is more obviously symbolic of Malaysia, consisting, as it does, of a Malaysian tiger. It is shown holding a torch, often used in heraldry to symbolise learning and teaching.

Our motto "Fortuna Eruditis Favet" derives from Louis Pasteur's famous phrase "la chance ne sourit qu'aux esprits bien preparés". Pasteur, commenting in 1855 on Oersted's "chance" discovery of electromagnetism, expressed the view that chance discoveries take place only in the context of a prepared mind. We have adapted the phrase to read "Fortune Favours the Prepared Mind" and this was translated into Latin by Professor Thomas N Mitchell, Provost and Professor of Latin at Trinity College Dublin.



THE MACE

In the medieval Europe, the mace was a weapon carried into battle by knights and warlike bishops, reflecting their status and prowess in the field. In the university context, it was carried as a weapon to protect the Chancellor, but it has now evolved into a purely ceremonial device signifying the dignity and authority of the Chancellor.

Designed by Royal Selangor Pewter Sdn Bhd, the Mace is 4.5ft in length. It is made of pewter in bright finish and its interior is supported by teakwood. Relevant parts are highlighted with 24-carat gold plating. The head of the Mace is a shining sun in gold plate and, directly underneath, the University's Coat of Arms is hand chased in relief on 925 sterling silver. The Sunway progressive "S" and hibiscus flower, also hand chased on silver and gold, represent the parentage of Sunway University, and the identity of Malaysia respectively. A crystal stone is set at the beginning of the name of the institution to mark the front section of the Mace.

The Mace rests on a nyatoh wood base in mahogany finish to complement the Chancellor's Chair.





The Chancellor's Chair is made of solid nyatoh wood, and finished in satin mahogany lacquer. The seat, backrest and armrests are wrapped with natural rich brown leather from Germany.

The Coat of Arms of the University, in a highly sculptured relief on a finely textured background, and cast in pewter with gold plating, is placed at the apex of the backrest. The apex itself is modelled on the upper part of the portico of the then Sunway University building.

Sunway University has its origins in Sunway College, founded by Y. Bhg. Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Jeffrey Cheah, AO, in 1986 to provide opportunities for young Malaysians to obtain higher education and training at the certificate, diploma and degree levels, especially in areas of national need. The first intake of students in 1987 numbered about 200, enrolled in degree studies leading to bachelor degrees from a number of foreign universities. These courses were delivered through the 'twinning' arrangements, pioneered by Sunway College, whereby students spent one or two years in Sunway and then transferred to the foreign university to complete their degrees.

Degree programmes of Western Michigan University (WMU) in the US were the first to be introduced and these were followed by twinning arrangements with a number of UK and Australian universities. In the late 1990s 3+0 degree programmes were approved by the Malaysian Government and Sunway College was able to offer the business degrees of Victoria University, Australia, entirely in Malaysia while continuing the 2+2 programmes with WMU.

In addition, the Malaysian Government sanctioned the establishment of branch campuses of foreign universities and Sunway again took the initiative. In an historic agreement with Monash University, Australia, the first branch campus of a foreign university was established at the Sunway campus in 1998. In July 2007, Monash University Sunway campus moved to a magnificent new campus at Jalan Lagoon Selatan, Bandar Sunway. It is currently offering a full range of undergraduate degrees, including medicine through its Jeffrey Cheah School of Medicine and Health Sciences, which was established in 2005.

In 2004 Sunway College was elevated to the status of a University College, by the then Minister of Higher Education Y. B. Dato' Dr Shafie Mohd Salleh, with the power to grant degrees. The courses leading to these degrees are approved by the Ministry of Higher Education and the Malaysian Qualifications Agency (MQA). It achieved an Excellent rating in the first official rating system of all universities and university colleges in Malaysia, the SETARA 2009 by the MQA. After consistently providing high quality standard education, Sunway received its university upgrade in December 2010. Sunway University was then officially registered in January 2011 and came into being with the vision of becoming a worldclass university.

When Sunway University achieved its full university status, its popular twinning, pre-University and professional accounting programmes were transferred to a new Sunway College therefore allowing the University to focus on its own diploma, undergraduate and postgraduate curricula.

Sunway University currently has a student population of over 4,000. It is a veritable global community on campus as around 30% of its total student number is international, coming from over 90 countries. Sunway campus is currently undergoing extensive expansion for the benefits of its future students.





Nurturing the Seeds of Wisdom



The fundamental premise of the Jeffrey Cheah Foundation is giving to society, a philosophy that has governed its predecessor, the former Sunway Education Trust Fund since its inception in 1997.

With the advent of this new special purpose non-profit vehicle, 11 education institutions making up the Sunway Education Group are transferred to the Foundation including Sunway University, Sunway College, Monash University Sunway campus, Sunway International School and the Jeffrey Cheah School of Medicine and Health Sciences. As a result of its special corporate structure and status as a registered charity, the Foundation is able to continue in perpetuity Y. Bhg. Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr. Jeffrey Cheah's vision and legacy of giving; while at the same time serving as a catalyst and as a vehicle for others to contribute to the shared cause of education.

Whether through the Trust Fund, or now the Foundation, operating surpluses are ploughed back into the academic institutions or disbursed as scholarships and research grants, ensuring that education of the highest quality is supported and sustained. Governed by a distinguished board of trustees, the Foundation aims to safeguard the institutions under its care for the purpose of providing an excellent and affordable education at the highest level, including education for those that come from disadvantaged backgrounds. There is thus a means, through scholarships, for the present and future generations of deserving students to succeed. To date, more than RM92 million in scholarships have been awarded to over 13,000 Malaysian students in various fields of study.

This unique structure is a first-of-its-kind in Malaysia for private education institutions, and modelled after the structure of some of the oldest and most eminent universities in the world, one being Harvard University.





Early in 2005, Sunway and Lancaster University in the UK commenced discussions on how the two institutions might co-operate and, in the course of these discussions, which extended over one year, the concept of joint degrees was explored. Lancaster conducted an institutional review in March 2006, which involved a site visit by senior academics from the University and a senior academic from the University of Sussex. As a result, in September 2006, Lancaster approved the signing of an affiliation agreement between the two institutions. The agreement provides for the validation of Sunway degrees by the Senate of Lancaster University following site visits by course consultants and lengthy panel discussions by video conference. Sunway University students who successfully complete an honours degree course are now awarded both Sunway and Lancaster degrees, with separate scrolls from each institution.

Lancaster University, founded in 1964, is one of Britain's best research and teaching universities. Lancaster University is ranked in the **top one percent** of universities in the world, listed at 131 in the Times Higher Education international table and 163 in the QS World University Rankings.

The growing reputation of Lancaster is reflected by high rankings year on year in each of the UK's major university league tables - The Times (12th), the Guardian (7th) and the Complete University Guide (9th).

Students at Lancaster University are more satisfied with their course than the average UK student according to the National Student Survey 2011. These results reflect the dedication of staff who work hard to ensure that every student who comes through Lancaster will receive the very best education. In Sunway University, which now has the power to award its own degrees, it is important to be able to satisfy ourselves, our students, and their parents, that the degree courses that we offer are of the highest international standard. We are pleased that we have been able to satisfy the very stringent criteria that have been set by Lancaster University in its institutional review and the validation of our degrees. We continue to look forward to delivering our degree programmes in the knowledge that they have been validated by a first class British university in accordance with its own quality assurance protocols and those of the UK Quality Assurance Agency.
