ANOTHER MILESTONE FOR SWG — THE FORMATION OF SUNWAY KERAMO

Sunway Keramo Sendirian Berhad (SKSB), a joint-venture between SungeiWay Group (SWG) and N V Keramo of Belgium will be the biggest vitrified clay pipe manufacturing plant in South East Asia.

The setting up of a \$35 million factory, which is to be located on a three-hectare site in the Klang Valley is expected to commence production in early 1992.

SKSB will have a capacity to produce 40,000 tonnes of "Keramo Brand" vitrified clay pipes and fittings annually under a two-shift operation.

For this, it will employ more than 200 staff and will be equipped with modern machinery and technology. All raw materials will be sourced locally.

SKSB also aims to be the market leader in the supply of vitrified clay pipes. It hopes to capture a large percentage of local clay pipes market and also export its product throughout the Asia Pacific region.

Vitrified clay pipes are used mainly as conduits for sewage treatment plants and oxidation ponds.

Sungei Way Marketing is at present importing the Belgian vitrified clay pipes for distribution in Malaysia as well as to Brunei, Singapore and Indonesia.

With the signing ceremony, which was held on 22nd November 1990, SWG has achieved yet another milestone in the rapid development of the company.

INTRODUCTION

"Concrete" a general term used daily in our construction industry, is a mass consisting of aggregates and sand mixed with a certain proportion of cement and water. The proportion of the mixes will depend on the strength of concrete required. The concrete by itself has no specific shape. 



As auditors, we travel extensively visiting subsidiary offices and operational sites so as to familiarise ourselves with the operations system and procedures implemented.



SUNGEIWAY GROUP FAMILY DAY AT SUBANG WONDERLAND


There was a hive of activities that set the mood for SungeiWay Group Family Day at Subang Wonderland on the 18th November 1990.

This has been the biggest turnout for Family Day so far with more than 1,000 employees and their families.

With such overwhelming support, it is hoped that the objective of

the Family Day – to foster better understanding and interaction between staff of the SungeiWay Group and their family members, will be met.

For this, a series of interesting telematches were organised for both adults and kids alike. Guffaws, giggles and cheers prevailed as each team tried to outdo the other. This was followed by lunch and later continued with rounds and rounds of fun rides.



The Resort Development forms the central core of the whole Bandar Sunway project and is sited on 175 acres out of the 500 acres of township.

The unique feature of this resort development is its location in a big depression that was formally a quarry

Instead of turning the huge depression into a big passive lake, the Resort Development would comprise a 500-room resort hotel, 200-units hotel suite, a proposed theme park (made up of Water Theme Park, Tin Mine Park and Family Fun Park), Tropical Garden Park, Amusement Lake and Amphitheatre.

The centre of it is a big clear lake of 17 acres and surrounded by 20 acres of lush landscaping and greenery with natural lime-stone outcrops and waterfalls.

All the components of this Resort Development are planned to integrate and compliment each other as the one-stop leisure centre.

The theme parks will comprise a Water Theme Park, similar in kind to that of Typhoon Lagoon Disney World (Orlando, USA) or the Sea-World (Australia), a Tin Mine park and a Family Fun park that will feature local cultural contents (for e.g. old tin mine, pottery making, pewter making, etc) and other facilities such as jungle boat rides, street stuntman shows and others.

The Conventional/Conference hotel is planned for 500 rooms with the supporting 200 units of all suites and will take a unique shape of a ship to tie in with the water and landscape theme of the development. It is designed to terrace all the way down to the lake with many of the rooms enjoying spectacular lake view. Facilities provided will cater for both local and overseas corporate conferences and at the same time provide accommodation for tourists visiting the theme parks.

The Amphitheatre will be highly sophisticated and it is felt that there is a need for such a facility to cater for both local and foreign stage performances.

The rest of the resort development will feature an active amusement lake and passive recreational activities with waterfalls, landscaping, pedestrian tracks, picnic areas and lots of food and beverage outlets in the Tropical Garden Park.
