The world's first hotel to be built in a disused quarry hole, currently undertaken by Bandar Sunway Sdn Bhd - a member of the SungeiWay Group - has been named "Sunway Lagoon Resort Hotel" by the Menteri Besar of Selangor, Tan Sri Muhammad Haji Muhammad Taib. The spectacular official naming ceremony which took place at the hotel site in Bandar Sunway on 12th September, was attended by 500 guests and staff.

This unique hotel, with its Disneyland facade, will have the largest man-made surf-wave pool with a water area of 13,000 sq.m. fronting a man-made beach - 180 in length. It will be the first hotel in South East Asia to have such an exciting feature.

Its grand ballroom with seating

capacity of 2,200 people, will be equipped with state-of-the-art visual facilities. It is destined to be the next convention centre in the Klang Valley.

Other facilities include executive meeting/function rooms, business centre, F&B outlets, gym and fitness centre, a themed Kiddy Camp (day care centre), swimming pool and cascading waterfalls and a piano lounge overlooking the Lagoon.

This hotel, with its wide range of facilities, is designed for the executive and his family - his family can have a holiday while he conducts his business.

Sunway Lagoon Resort Hotel, to be built in a lushly landscapped resort environment, will have the Sunway Lagoon Theme Park and the now-under-construction shopping mall, Sunway Capitol as neighbours.

Sunway Lagoon Theme Park comprises the Waterpark (which won the 1993 Leisure Development of the Year Award), Adventure Park and Wild, Wild, West which will be ready by early next year. Sunway Capitol, with a gross built-up area of 250,000 sq.m, will be a one-stop entertainment centre, featuring an open ice-skating link within the mall, cineplexes, bowling alley and many more attractions.

The RM260 million, 19-storey Sunway Lagoon Resort Hotel, with 450 rooms will be completed by mid 1996.

Hotel Sunway Lagoon Resort

Hotel pertama di dunia ini yang dibina diatas bekas tapak lombong telah dinamakan SUNWAY LAGOON RESORT HOTEL oleh Menteri Besar Selangor, Tan Sri Muhammad Haji Muhammad Taib. Upacara rasmi penamaan hotel oleh beliau, disaksikan oleh lebih 500 orang tetamu jemputan serta kakitangan Kumpulan SungeiWay.

Hotel tersebut yang unik dengan bahagian depannya yang bercirikan "Disneyland", akan mempunyai kolam "surf wave", buatan manusia, yang terbesar di dunia. Kolam yang sebesar13,000 meter persegi tersebut berhadapan dengan pantai buatan manusia, sepanjang 180 meter. Dewan utamanya pula boleh memuatkan seramai 2,200 orang pada satu-satu masa dan mempunyai kelengkapan audio visual yang terkini. Ia akan merupakan pusat konvensyen di Lembah Kelang.

Hotel ini yang lengkap dengan pelbagai kemudahan, direka khas untuk para eksekutif dan keluarganya - sementara dia menjalankan urusan perniagaannya, keluarganya dapat bercuti.

Sunway Lagoon Resort Hotel ini akan dibina dengan landskap ala "resort"; berjirankan Sunway Lagoon Theme Park dan kompleks membeli-belah Sunway Capitol, yang kini di dalam proses pembinaan. Sunway Lagoon Theme Park merangkumi Taman Air yang telah memenangi Hadiah Pembangunan Rekreasi Terbaik Tahun 1993, Taman Adventure dan Wild Wild West yang akan siap sepenuhnya pada awal tahun depan.

Sunway Capitol pula, dengan keluasan 250,000 meter persegi akan menjadi sebuah pusat hiburan dengan adanya tempat permainan luncur ais, pawagam, tempat bowling dan banyak lagi tarikan lain.

Sunway Building Technology Berhad

The signing of underwriting agreement between Sunway Building Technology Berhad (SBT) and 7 underwriters was held on 13 September in the Penthouse, Menara SungeiWay.

The underwriters are Permata Merchant Bank Berhad, which is also the Adviser and Managing Underwriter, Aseambankers Malaysia Berhad, PB Securities Sdn Bhd, Rashid Hussain Securities Sdn Bhd, SBB Securities Sdn Bhd, Zalik Securities Sdn Bhd and Bapema Corporation Sdn Bhd. The 7 parties had undertaken to underwrite the entire portion of 6.582 million ordinary shares in SBT's shares in SBT at an offer price of RM2.35 per share. The offer is in relation to the proposed listing of SBT's shares on the Main Board of the Kuala Lumpur Stock Exchange. Of the total 8.1 million shares available for subscription under the Offer for Sale, 6.582 million shares will be allocated to the general public and the remaining 1.518 million shares will be reserved for the eligible Directors and employees of the SBT Group.

SBT is principally involved in the manufacturing of ready-mixed concrete and various concrete products such as concrete pavers, hollow concrete blocks, precast concrete piles and provision of transportation services, piling services and hiring of heavy machineries. The company is expected to be listed at the end of October, 1994.






Konsert Emas MPPJ 1994


