SMS is the first ready-mixed concrete company in Malaysia to be awarded the MS ISO 9002 certificate from SIRIM for quality assurance in the production and supply of ready-mixed concrete.

**Sun-Block Sdn Bhd (SB)** manufactures concrete products such as hollow concrete blocks, hollow core slabs, concrete inter-locking pavers, precast concrete piles, decorative Concrete Masonry Units, high quality concrete bricks and bag concrete.



# Malaysian and Thai Deputy Prime Ministers at ASLI's Conference

The Asian Strategy & Leadership Institute (ASLI) and the Penang Development Corporation (PDC) recently held an International Conference on the Indonesia-Malaysia-Thailand (IMT) Growth Triangle in December 1994 in Penang. This high-level conference was officiated by the Deputy Prime Minister of Malaysia, YAB Dato Seri Anwar Ibrahim.

Amongst the prominent distinguished speakers at the conference were the Deputy Prime Minister of Thailand, H.E. Dr Supachai; the Chief Minister of Penang, YAB Dr Koh Tsu Koon; and the Economic Adviser to the Government, Tun Daim Zainuddin.

In his Opening Address, Dato Seri Anwar complimented ASLI and PDC for jointly organising this top-level conference. He also spoke about the potentials of growth triangles and the need for these to be private-sector led but warned about regional

inequalities. The Deputy Prime Minister stressed that the central objective of intra-Asean economic coopeation is to stimulate growth and to promote social justice. "All our efforts must go beyond the realm of trade, commerce & development and reach for the more enduring goal of promoting greater understanding among the people of Asean and in so doing lay the foundations for a lasting bond on kinship within the Asean fraternity," concluded Dato Seri Anwar.

This IMT-GT International Conference concluded ASLI's series of business conferences for 1994 which has positioned ASLI as Malaysia's foremost conference organiser.

Sungei Way Quarry Industries Sdn Bhd said it has been awarded a contract to construct a section of the proposed RM700 million Middle Ring Road II (MRR II) project around Kuala Lumpur.

The contract, known as "Package 9C" was handed over to the SungeiWay Group Managing Director, Mr Chew Chee Kin by Works Minister, Datuk Leo Moggie in October 1994.

There are 10 packages under the MRR II, which will be a six-lane divided freeway that will serve as an outer ring road to facilitate peripheral traffic movements around Kuala Lumpur.

Its total length is about 32 km of which 18 km is to be constructed following the existing road an the rest along new alignments.

Valerie Jaques, the ever-friendly counsellor

Counselling was something that you needed if you had a big problem; those days! Not anymore.

At Sunway College, you see students frequenting the Student Counsellor's room and it literally keeps the ever-friendly lady occupied throughout the day.

Valerie Jaques, the counsellor with a smiling, friendly face, made a career out of helping students with problems, varying from family, relationships to studying and stress-related problems.

Counselling services provided by the Student Services Department, is made known to all Sunway College students during orientation where the department is introduced and study skills workshops are organised.

"The workshops provide two way communication which helps the students overcome their shyness and eventually talk about the problems they are facing," said Valerie.

Initially, students go to her with problems relating to their courses, such as combination of subjects in relation to their future careers. Once they are used to this, they start confiding in her about their problems with families, friends, etcetera.

According to Valerie, more students have realised that every individual is plaqued with some kind of problem in his life, this is especially so when coping with growth and studies. And, there is nothing to be shy about going for counselling. In fact, it is a healthy avenue for discussing problems, especially when one is assured of confidentiality.

With 6 years experience behind her, Valerie is taking things in her stride, although her former counselling work was with a women's organisation, where she dealt with an entirely different set of problems.

A graduate in Science, Valerie went through a one year training in counselling at a counselling centre attached to her church, where she did volunteer services. She also pursued a two-year correspondence course in counselling.

There is still ongoing training that she attends every now and then. Training is conducted by psychiatrists, psychologists, religious teachers, social workers and counsellors, from abroad and locally.

Imparting her knowledge to students, Valerie has embarked on training Peer Counsellors among students. This would enable students to confide in their peers who are trained.
