A Visit to Harare, Zimbabwe

Prime Minister Dato' Seri Dr Mahathir took the opportunity to visit Sunway City's proposed development in Zimbabwe when he was there recently for the Solar Summit. This occasion was also graced by Dato' Leo Moggie and Zimbabwe's Minister of Industry & Commerce, Minister of Finance and Minister of Transport.

The Prime Minister and the ministers were greeted at the Harare Sunway City office by Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Jeffrey Cheah where they were given a briefing of the proposed development by our Project Manager, Mr Ong Pang Yen...

The site will be developed into a 1,500 hectares integrated industrial township. This will be done in a joint venture between Sunway City Berhad and the Industrial Development Corporation of Zimbabwe. The project is expected to span a period of 15 years.

After the briefing, the delegation proceeded to a visit at the site which is located about 15 km out of Harare.

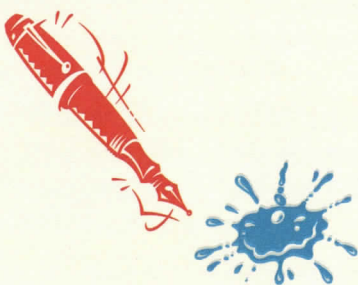

SUNWAY HOTEL GIVES ST JOSEPH ORPHANAGE A FACELIFT

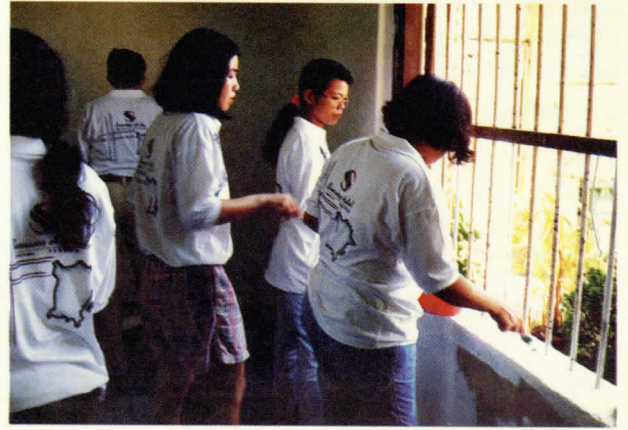

He would like to see the various industries that the Group are in, to be linked to various popular

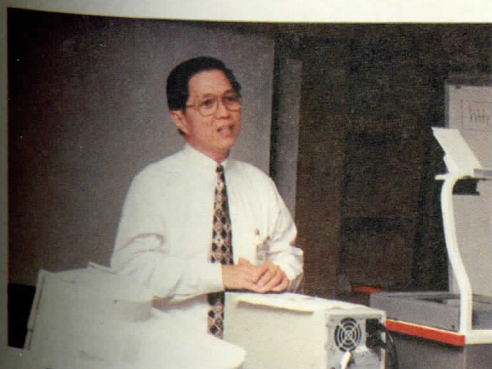

Signing Ceremony for the Development of Chruoy Changvar

A joint venture agreement between Sunway City Cambodia and the Royal Government of Cambodia was signed in Phnom Penh, Cambodia on 21st October.

The proposed joint venture is to develop a US\$1 billion (RM2.5 billion) township project. The township will be developed on a 400 hectare piece of land located on the Chruoy Changvar peninsula at the confluence of the Tonle Sap and Mekong Rivers.

The project will be undertaken by Sunway City Cambodia Limited - in which the SungeiWay Group is to take up a 80 per cent stake in the US\$10 million (RM25 million) paid-up capital, while the rest is held by the Cambodian

Government.

The project is expected to take 15 years to complete, and would represent the second biggest foreign investments in Cambodia, since 1991.

The new township which will be built on reclaim swampland will feature residential, commercial, industrial and resort areas.

The agreement was signed in Phnom Penh by SungeiWay Group president, Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Jeffrey Cheah in the presence of First Prime Minister, Prince Norodom Ranaridh and Malaysian Deputy Minister of Land and Co-operative, Dr Goh Cheng Teik.
