Bandar Sunway Signs Agreement With Zimbabwe

Bandar Sunway Bhd signed a memorandum of understanding with the Industrial Development Corporation (IDC) of Zimbabwe to develop a RM4 billion 1,500ha industrial park in Harare, Zimbabwe.

The proposed joint venture in Ventersburg Estate, 7.5km east of the capital, will be developed by Bandar Sunway Bhd over 15 years.

It will be an integrated industrial township incorporating an inland port with inland customs clearing, industrial buildings, bonded warehousing, export free zone centre, hotels, commercial offices and residential areas.

The development will be undertaken by a company incorporated in Zimbabwe in which Bandar Sunway and IDC will be the shareholders. (IDC is a corporation fully-owned by the Government of Zimbabwe).

President Mugabe's Visit to Bandar Sunway

The President who headed a nine-member delegation, was in Malaysia for a four-day state visit in November.

He also visited the SungeiWay Group of companies at Menara SungeiWay, Bandar Sunway. Accompanied by the Health Minister, Datuk Chua Jui Meng, Dr Mugabe was met by the Group President, Dato' Dr Jeffrey Cheah and senior executives of the Group.

He was briefed about the development of Bandar Sunway and was given an insight of the plans in store for this self-contained, resort style township.

Dr Mugabe who had expressed his hope that Malaysia and Zimbabwe could embark on an exchange programme involving Professors and Post-graduate students, also visited the Sunway College. Dato' Dr Jeffrey Cheah announced that the Group will be awarding bursaries to 5 Zimbabwe students chosen by the Zimbabwe Government.

He later toured the Sunway Lagoon Theme Park before adjourning to the Sunway Sayang Restaurant for a luncheon hosted by the Group.

With this objective in mind, Sungei Way Construction Sdn Bhd, a subsidiary of the Group, recently donated RM31,000 to three deserving organisations and a former employee during a Charity Nite.

The event, held at Citadel Sound Castle in Bandar Sunway, was attended by over 300 sub-contractors and suppliers as well as employees of the company.

SungeiWay Group Managing Director, Dato' Chew Chee Kin, presented the donations to the Sungei Way Old Folks' Home (RM10,000), Cancerlink Foundation (RM8,000) and Women's Aid Organisation (RM8,000). Former employee Mr Teh Leong Hoo, who was not present, received RM5,000.

Said Mr Tan Kia Loke, Managing Director of Sungei Way Holdings Bhd, "Since our Charity Nite was first mooted in 1992, we have managed to donate a total of RM112,000 to various charitable organisations through our fund raising efforts."

To manage the funds raised, a trust fund called the Sungei Way Construction Charity Trust Fund was recently established and will be headed by three trustees, Mr Tan Kia Loke, Mr Ng Kit Heng and Mr Wang Yeong Khang.

"Under the terms of the trust deed, only 50 per cent of the funds raised plus income from accumulated funds can be utilised. We hope to identify other projects in the near future that we can contribute to, in keeping with our objective of helping the less fortunate in our multi-racial society," added Mr K L Tan.

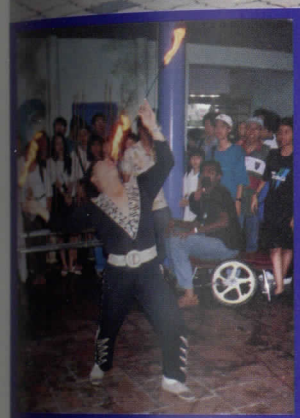

In true spirit of the year-end festive season, Sunway Lagoon Theme Park hosted a series of charity events.

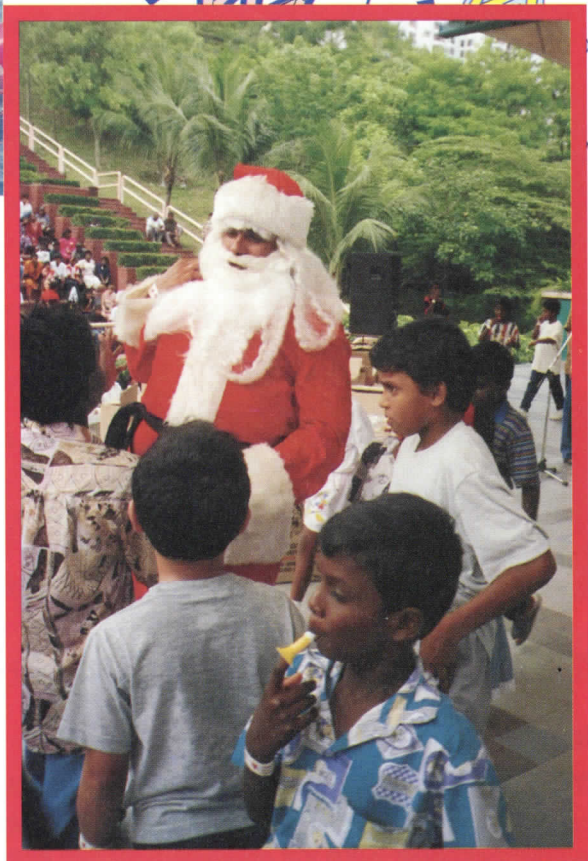
The first project was held for 400 underprivileged children from rural areas and 100 kidney patients, in conjunction with their 3rd birthday celebration.

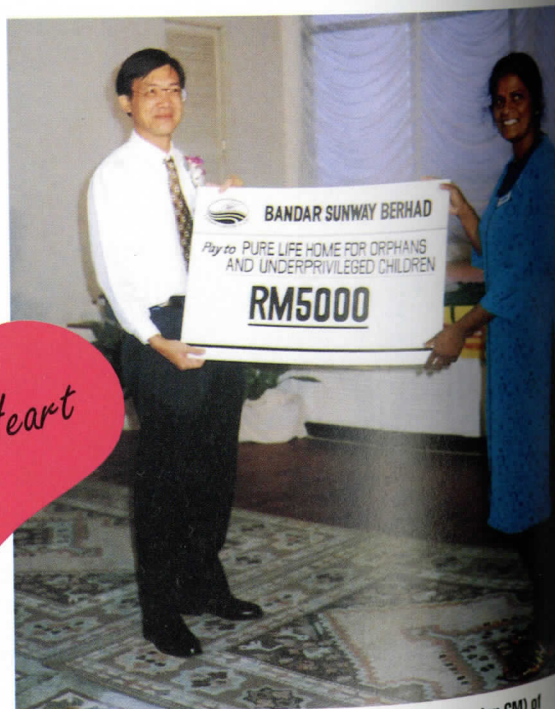

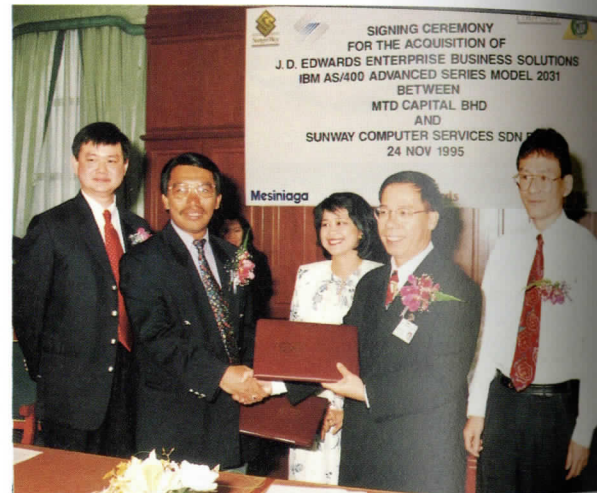

SRW, the parent company of International Footwear Sdn Bhd, manufactures rubber shoes under the Pallas brand name.



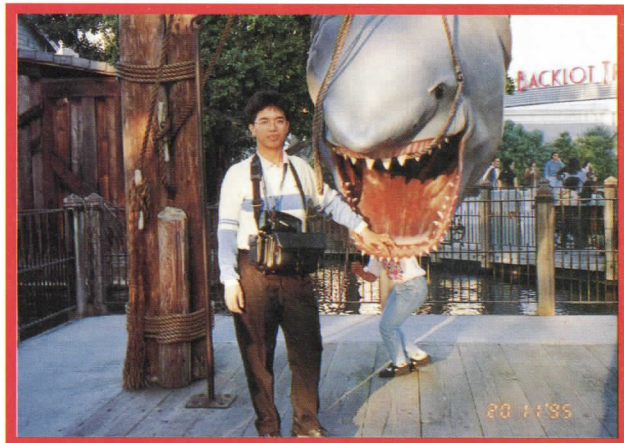

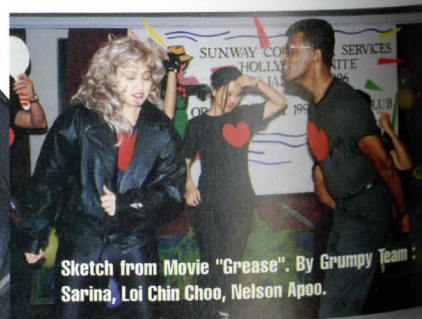

Guests were well-entertained with dance shows, the Launch Master, and the Singing Shop. There were also games, lucky draws and spot dances.

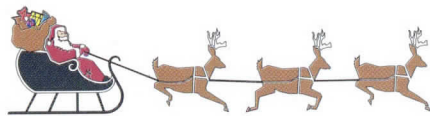

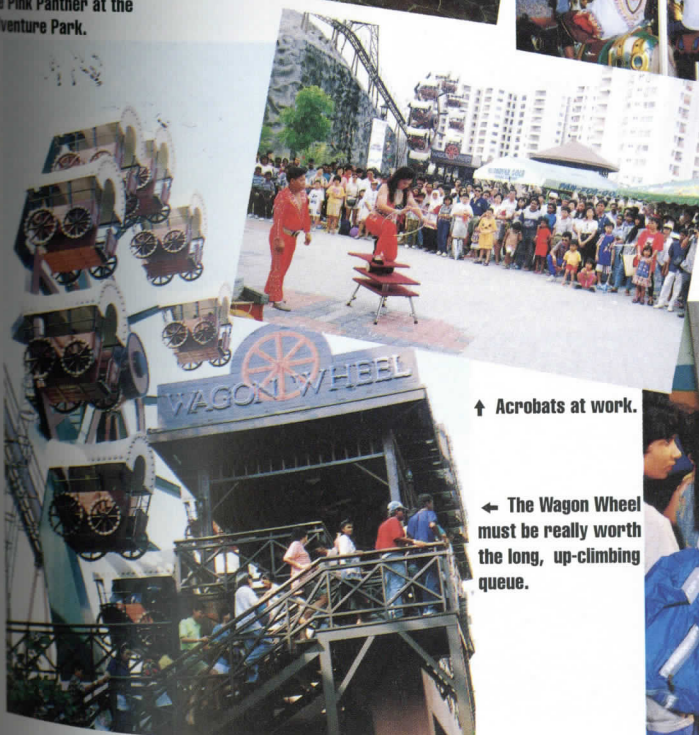

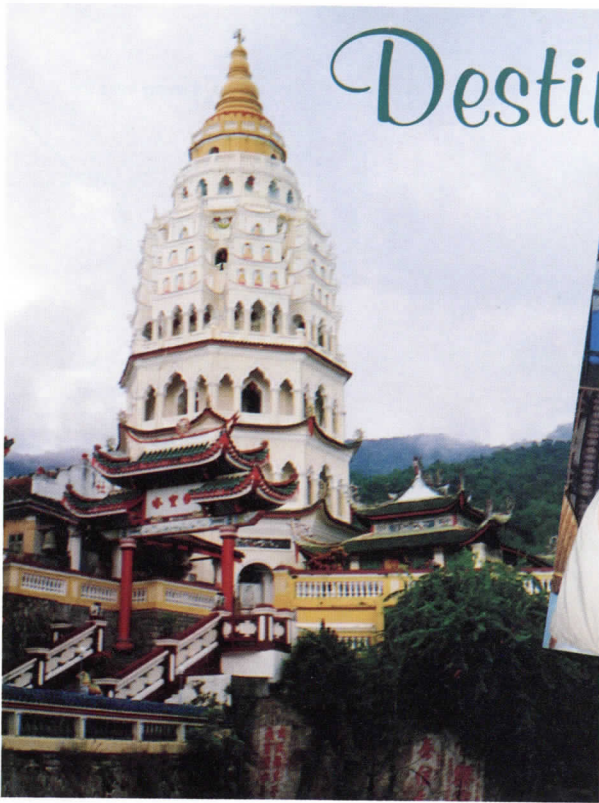

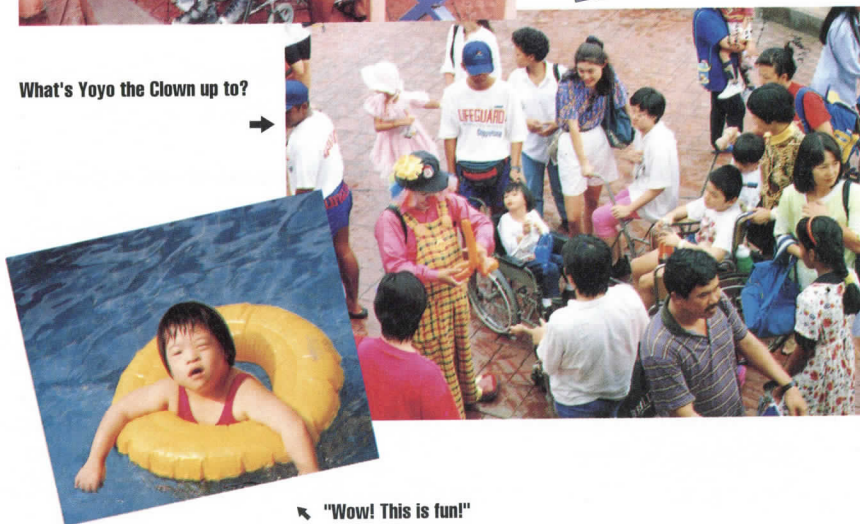

SungeiWay's RM2 million contribution to the nation...the month of November 1995 saw the culmination of another SungeiWay's contribution to the nation - this time in the form of a secondary school in Bandar Sunway which was abandoned by the contractor.

Seeing the dilapidated state of the abandoned school, Dato' Dr Jeffrey Cheah in early 1995, proposed to the Prime Minister that SungeiWay undertake at its own additional cost of RM2 million to finish the construction of the school which was only 20% physically completed at that time.

Sungei Way Construction was once again requested to undertake this 'rescue' job. This, it managed to achieve 3 months ahead of its original completion date to allow the school to be used for the new term beginning in December 1995. This rare feat was greatly appreciated by JKR and the local Education Department. To top it all, the Inspectorate of Schools which inspected the school during the handover commended SungeiWay for the quality work undertaken. The list of 'defect works' was almost nil - something he has not seen before.

The school is now regarded as a 'model school' for future schools to be constructed. JKR has recently requested for photographs of the school for its reference use.

The abandoned project →



The school named 'Sekolah Menengah Bandar Sunway' has a total of 36 classrooms, capable of accommodating 1500 - 1800 students. It is built in 4 blocks with an agricultural workshop and a canteen. It is also equipped with modern facilities such as computer rooms, laboratories, dentist and health rooms, a purpose built science rooms and a big field.

Some distinctive features 'pioneered' in this 'model school' is the use of roof tiles instead of corrugated asbestos roof and the use of 'pavers' instead of precast in hardstanding areas. It is also painted in lively colours. All this allow it to blend in with the exquisite environment of the model township of Bandar Sunway.

This contribution to the nation and society by the Sungei Way Group has added another feather to its proud record as a good and responsible corporate citizen.
