Sunway-Western Michigan University (WMU) Honors Convocation was held on 23rd November.

34 Sunway-WMU twinning degree programme students from the May 1996 semester were in the Dean's List (this means they received a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CPGA) of 3.5 or higher; out of 4 distinctions, on all subjects).

The outstanding first semester students award went to Honey Lim, who received a GPA of 3.91 while taking 17 credit hours of studies. She received the "Thinking Cap" award - a WMU baseball cap! Four other students also received GPAs over 3.75 and were awarded frisbies (plastic flying saucers) for their high-flying academic performances!

Transfer Scholarships of US\$750 each were awarded to Nurita bt Mohd Seth, Anthony Lai Vui Yin and Situti bt Che Aziz with CGPA of 3.88, 3.67 and 3.65 respectively.

A Merit Scholarship of US\$4,000 was also awarded to Nurita for her overall excellence in the WMU True-Twinning Program at Sunway College by Professor Howard Dooley, Executive Director of International Affairs of WMU.

Sunway College launched a three year NCC (National Computing Centre) special graduate diploma programme for SPM/ O' Level/MICSS students leading to the B.Sc (Hons) degree in Computing and Information Systems from the London Guildhall University.

SPM Revision Seminars

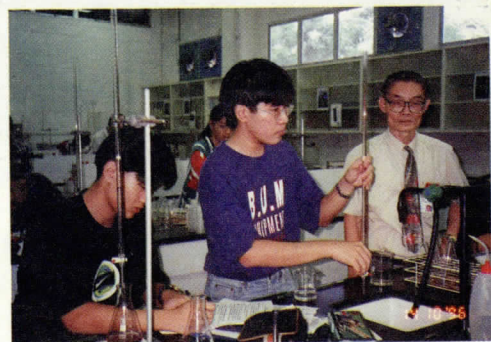

Sunway College intends to conduct more of such seminars for the benefit of SPM students!

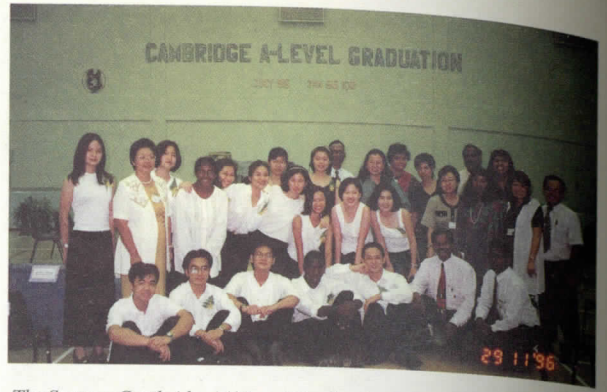

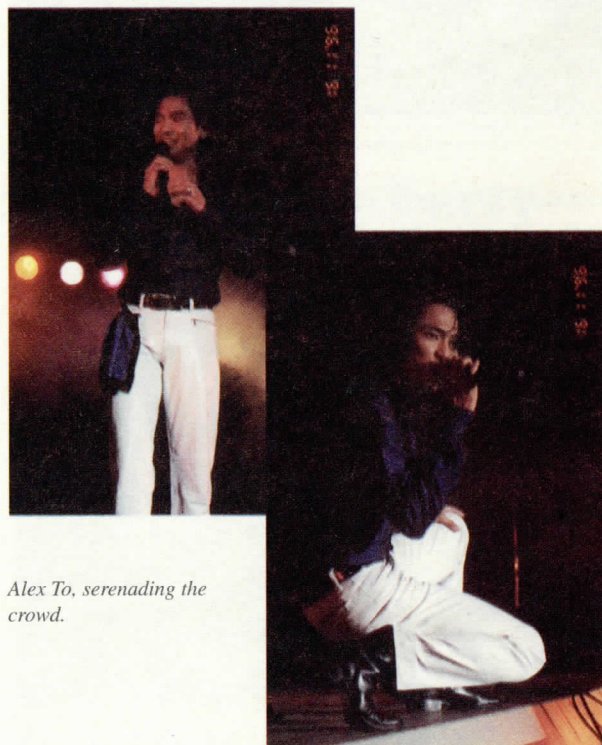

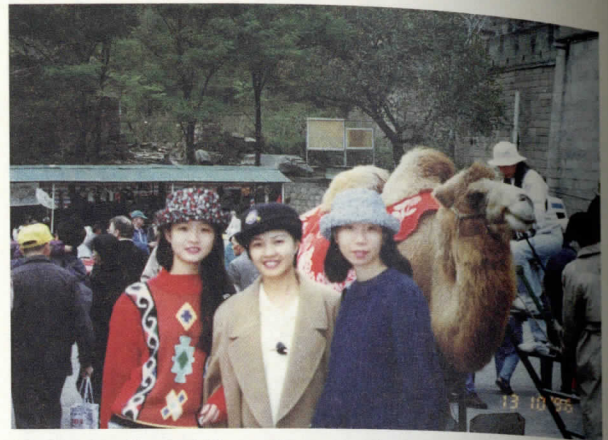
Food suited our taste buds just fine as our tour guides served us typical spicy Malaysian food besides the popular local dishes.

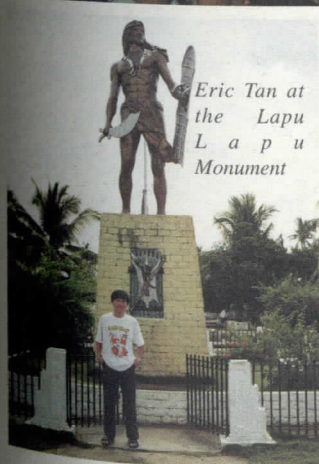
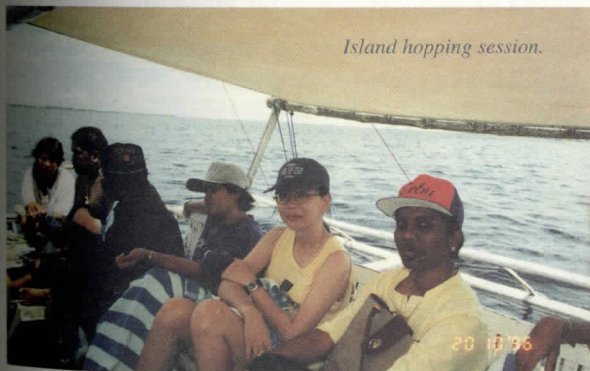
The third day, we were transferred to Mactan Island after stopping by the Lapu Lapu Monument and the guitar factory.

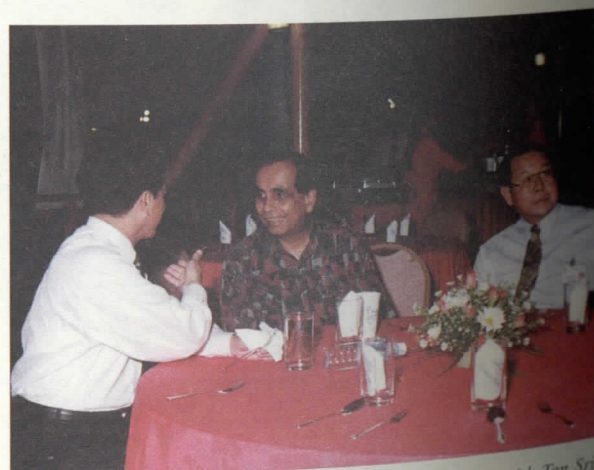

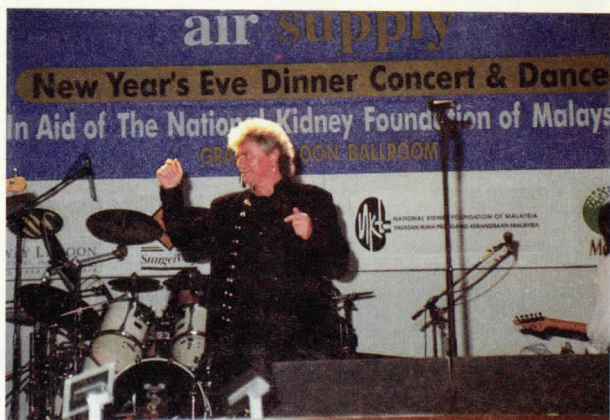
This was swiftly followed by the dimming of the hall and Air Supply made their appearance with their biggest hit - *Lost In Love*.

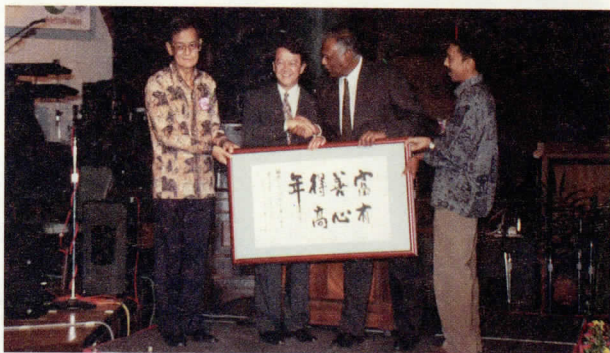

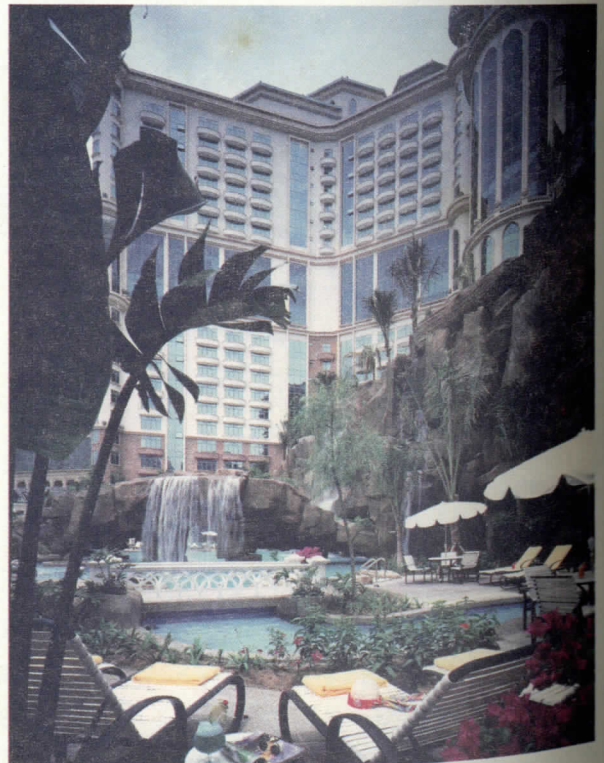
