Victoria University of Technology

Citation JEFFREY CHEAH

Chancellor,

Victoria University of Technology was founded in 1990 by an Act of the Victorian State Government and, on 1 January 1992 the Institutes from which it was to be formed amalgamated and the University operated as a single entity.

In 1970, one of the Institutes, the Footscray Institute of Technology, awarded to Jeffrey Cheah a Diploma of Business Studies. The award and the course of studies upon which it was based, marked the beginning of a relationship between Jeffrey Cheah and Victoria University of Technology which reaches a very important stage in this Ceremony.

Following the award of his Diploma, Jeffrey Cheah returned to Malaysia and began to develop his professional career. In 1974, he founded what was to become the SungeiWay Group of Companies and he now holds the position of President of a conglomerate that is based here in Kuala Lumpur and operates in four countries. The continuing successes of the company he founded are a testament to Jeffrey Cheah's entrepreneurship, business acumen and concern for the wellbeing of all who work in it.

In 1987, Jeffrey Cheah established Sunway College in Kuala Lumpur, an innovative educational institution from which, after completing two years of tertiary study, its students travel to an overseas institution to qualify for their degree. The educational program provided by Sunway College is in accord with its founder's understanding of the need for educated people to be exposed to societies and cultures other than their own. Jeffrey Cheah has presided over the establishment of twinning agreements, a concept he devised, with eight international institutions in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and the United States of America, thereby facilitating international exchange programs for Malaysian students.

In 1988, the Sultan of Selangor conferred upon Jeffrey Cheah the title Dato' Paduka Mahkota Selangor, in recognition of his contributions to the State of Selangor.

In his professional life as an international business leader and in his personal commitment to the educational enterprise across the international community, Jeffrey Cheah has demonstrated high intellectual and cultural achievement and a compassionate regard for his compatriots and others.

Victoria University is fortunate in having Jeffrey Cheah as one of its most distinguished graduates. He has demonstrated his own regard for the education he received by providing from his personal resources four scholarships to assist overseas students to attend the University.

The award of an honorary degree is a rare event for a university and it is the unanimous decision of the Council of Victoria University of Technology that Jeffrey Cheah should be the first person to receive such an award.

Chancellor, in recognition of his outstanding contribution to industry, commerce and higher education in Malaysia and especially to the internationalisation of university level education and for his services to Victoria University of Technology through the promotion of its activities as both an alumnus and benefactor, I have the honour to present to you, Dato' Jeffrey Cheah, Diploma of Business Studies of the Footscray Institute of Technology, for admission, to the Degree of Doctor of the University, *honoris causa*.

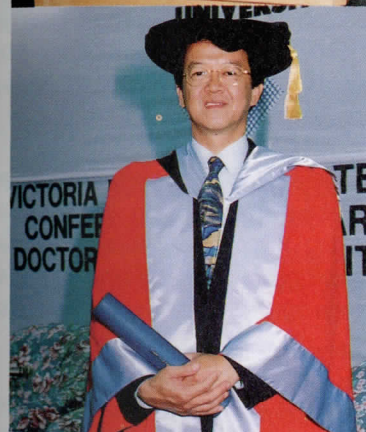
DATO' JEFFREY CHEAH'S DOCTORATE CONFERRAL

DATO' SERI RAFIDAH AZIZ OPENS SUNWAY KERAMO FACTORY

Sunway Keramo Sdn Bhd (SK) was officially declared open by Y B Dato' Seri Rafidah Aziz, Minister of International Trade & Industry on 20th April 1993.

SK is a joint venture company formed between Sungei Way Holdings Berhad and Keramo Wienerberger NV of Belgium (KW). This RM 40 million state-of-the-art plant is the only one, not only in Malaysia but in South East Asia, to manufacture fully glazed vitrified clay pipes (VCPs) and fittings to International Standards for sewerage and drainage purposes.

SungeiWay's partnership with KW, a market leader in Europe, commenced way back in 1986 as the sole agent for Keramo VCPs for Malaysia, Singapore and Brunei. Now, with the new plant in operation, future markets shall also include the Far East and the ASEAN countries.

Briefly, the most important features of fully glazed Keramo VCPs are perhaps their durability and resistance against aggressive chemicals and extreme temperatures. Unaffected by sewer gases or corrosive soils, these VCPs do not distort under intense heat or pressures. On top of that, they do not pose any danger to health and environment as in the case of asbestos-cement pipes. A vitrified clay sewer properly laid and joined will, if not disturbed by external forces, remains serviceable indefinitely.

All these make Keramo VCPs very cost-effective. Instead of spending a lot of money to rehabilitate and reline easily damaged sewer pipes, millions of ringgit can be saved. Besides, these VCPs can be laid directly and easily on the trench. The minimal bedding required reduces construction costs. There is also no need for complicated cutting and joining processes. These VCPs come in a complete range of pipes and fittings to fulfill any engineering design and requirement. Furthermore, Keramo VCPs are prefabricated with flexible profiled rubber rings and polyurethane in the case of larger diameters to ensure water tightness, and to save time, labour and cost.

Last but not least, we also take this opportunity to personally thank all concerned and especially the Organising Committee comprising Mr Henry Yuen, En Abdullah Mohamed, Mr Gilbert Tan, Mr N S Lee, En Major Shariman, Ms Joyce Liew, Cik Sharidah Pawanteh and Ms Josephine Hoo who have taken a lot of their invaluable time and effort to help ensure the successful opening of our Sunway Keramo factory.

The use of natural gas makes the manufacturing process more environmental-friendly, besides eliminating wastage of fuel.

BANDAR SUNWAY (PENANG) SDN BHD SIGNS AGREEMENT WITH AMMB FOR RM100 MILLION SYNDICATED LOAN.

Bandar Sunway (Penang) Sdn Bhd and Arab Malaysian Merchant Bank Berhad (AMMB) recently signed an agreement for a syndicated financial package of RM100 million held at Equatorial Hotel on June 15, 1993. Seven other financial institutions participated in the loan facility. They are :-

- * Ban Hin Lee Bank Berhad
- * Bank Utama (Malaysia) Berhad
- * Development & Commercial Bank Berhad
- * Malaysian French Bank Berhad

The loan facility is for the purpose of financing the development of 124 units of 3 and 4 storey-shophouses at Seberang Jaya Town Centre and partial financing of the acquisition of land from Penang Development Corporation. The development of Seberang Jaya represents the first venture of Bandar Sunway outside of Selangor. Development within the vicinity of the town centre comprise of a cultural complex, 2 shopping malls, 3 departmental stores, 2 office blocks, 3 international hotels, a 26-storey aservice apartment block, sports stadium and a medical centre. When fully completed, the market commercial value is estimated at RM1billion.

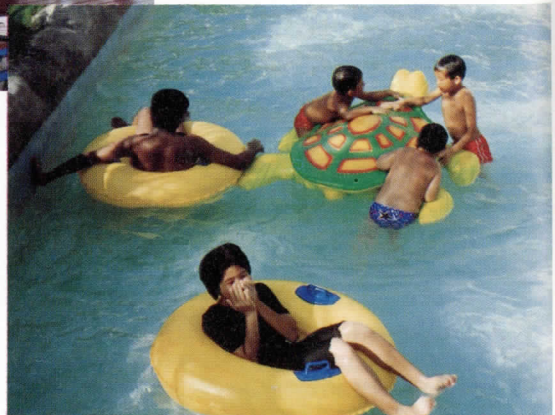

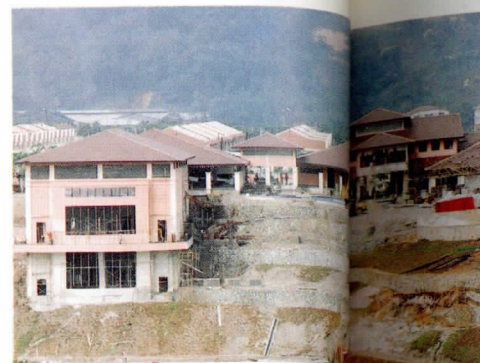

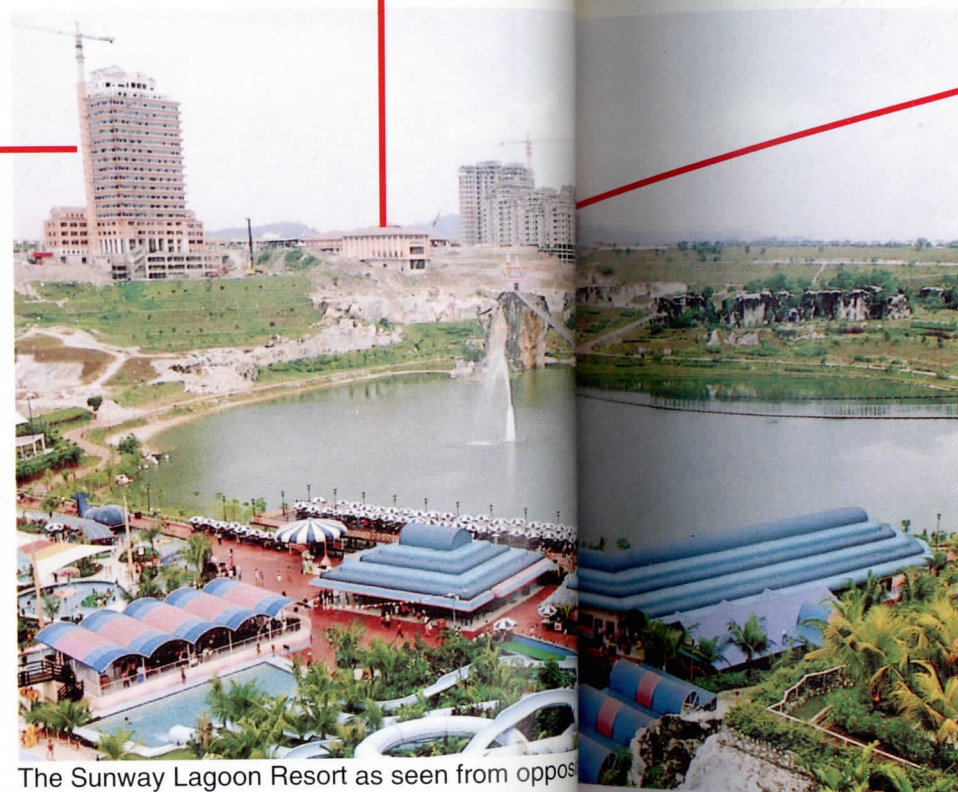

A student's view point on:-

HOSTEL LIFE FOR CANADIAN MATRICULATION PROGRAMME

Anyone who is going to a college which is far from their hometown, would like to stay at some place that is near to their college. Family-oriented houses, student rental houses, flats, apartment or hostels are just a few examples of places where students can live. Well, for most students, they would prefer staying outside where freedom, 'good food' and 'good times' are more abundant. However, if you are in a college which is in the middle of nowhere - like Sunway College - then hostel life is what you endure. Nearly 900 students at Sunway College endure this life and I am one of those students.

Sunway College - the newest, magnificent and probably the most luxuriously built college in Malaysia - costing a cool RM120 million and regarded by taxi drivers as a country resort or club - is literally built in the middle of nowhere. Therefore, students from near or far in Malaysia and overseas have to no other choice but to stay in 'Lego built Sunway Hostel City'. It has 8 blocks of apartments, a supermarket-sized convenience store, a spacious launderette (nearly completed), 3 badminton courts and many interlock pathways bordered with colourful flowering bushes and trees that will in time give us needed shade so that we can enjoy the benches and tables for much of the day. The tennis, basketball and netball courts and the football field are nearby.

Although the Sunway Hostel may seem to be very artificial, it has a 'life' and a 'pulse' of its own. That 'life' starts at 7.30am - some freaks start earlier by doing Tai Chi, running around the lagoon, playing tennis in the cool of the early morning- and end around 6.00am the next morning. Weird, huh! What do the students do during this time? If you think I am going to provide the answer, think again! Even, Dr Rex Sharman or Hostel Master Mr Tan does not have that answer.

At around 7.30am, alarm clocks can be heard, and a few minutes after that, the whole lot of students who have doused themselves with perfume, cologne, baby powder... then greased their hair, donned 'T' shirts and jeans and unlaced reeboks - the Sunway College's uniform code - flock out just like Canadian geese and fly to class. Some look as if they are just out from a dream, some look mighty disheveled, some look fresh and some look just...normal - by students' standard, that is. Remember your mum's words - 'Eat more veggies and fruits, take your words - 'Eat more veggies' and fruits, take your vitamins everyday, and get to bed early every night'. Graduation is in the air !

A go-getter, Mr Frankie Ang

It is not an easy job turning a bankrupt company around. It is time consuming and more difficult when a person who is not familiar with the in-and-out of the business world were to handle it.

However, for the General Manager of Sunway-PMI, Frankie Ang, it was a responsibility for him to carry through and to prove his capability as a Manager as well as a professional engineer.

A believer of "nothing is impossible in this world", Frankie managed to carry out his job with confidence although his success was not achieved within the blink of an eye. The administration of the company was restructured, from planning as well as strategies because the previous company's image had to be shed off to give the consumers confidence in the new method introduced.

"That was why the precast mico-injection pile using the hydraulic system did not receive good response when we introduced it initially. However, the huge budget allocated for research and development gave us the confidence to continue developing the system. Moreover, we were working with a group of staff and young engineers who were all very ambitious," he said.

Frankie did not deny that turning around a company which was bankrupt needed mental and physical strength. The trust that the company placed upon him was a foundation for him to achieve this success. It was obvious that the four years effort put in by a team of young professionals, lead by Frankie Ang had not gone to waste. Todate, Sunway PMI has successfully completed about 300 construction projects with a RM30 million turnover, using the new piling system.

A local from Banting, Selangor, Frankie had gone through challenging times before he succeeded as a professional engineer. Like any other young person, Frankie, 36, who has a degree in civil engineering from the Leicester University, Britain, is still not satisfied with his achievement as he feels that there are still lots of weaknesses which need to be overcome. "We need to upgrade the performance of the piling system from time to time, to cater for heavier requirements, such as the construction of hotels and big complexes," he stressed.

About his profession as an engineer, Frankie says he will make use of his capability to upgrade the building construction management and at the same time introduce new ideas for the benefit of the company. Before taking up the post as a manager, Frankie was a contractor. A year later, he was offered the post of Concrete Quality Control Manager by the SungeiWay Group. Two years after his promotion to Production Manager, and based on his performance, Frankie was entrusted with bringing around a bankrupt company which the SungeiWay Group acquired in 1989. Within four years, the company has today become one of the very successful construction companies .
