INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION CONFERENCE

It was indeed a meeting of the best minds of education as a group of distinguished local and world class educationists converged at the Crown Princess Hotel, Kuala Lumpur during the International Education Conference on 21 and 22 June recently, jointly organised by the Asian Strategy and Leadership Institute (ASLI) and Sunway College.

The Conference was officiated by the Minister of Education, YB Datuk Amar Sulaiman Haji Daud who was greeted by ASLI's Executive

The session on the Open Learning concept drew much interest from the delegates as did the views of prominent educationist Tan Sri Dato' Dr Awang Had Salleh on how the corporate sector could contribute to the education

Most felt that although Malaysia has the makings of a regional education centre, much need to be done by the government in partnership with the private sector to attain this. What did he leave behind? A

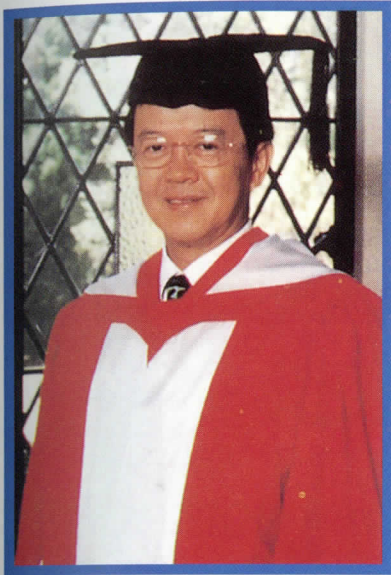

DATO' (DR) JEFFREY CHEAH CONFERRED A DOCTORATE BY UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA

The President of the SungeiWay Group, Dato' Dr Jeffrey Cheah has been conferred the honorary degree of Education by the University of Western Australia (UWA).

UWA's Vice-Chancellor Professor

Fay Gale who was in Kuala Lumpur recently, for the UWA graduation said the award to Dato' Cheah is in recognition of Dato' Cheah's "pioneering role, contribution and commitment towards the development of Malaysian-Australian educational programmes".

SungeiWay College, which is part of the SungeiWay Group, is the brainchild of Dato' Cheah.

She added that while they were cautious about conferring honorary doctorate awards at UWA, "Education has always been valued as a lasting matter, a subject that endures for life, thus the award speaks for itself."

So far, only three Malaysians and a Singaporean have been conferred the honorary titles from UWA.

standards achieved by Sunway College students.

In a recent official ranking of Australian Universities, the first ever by the Australian Federal Government, the University of Western Australia is ranked top besides the University of Melbourne and the Australian National University.

The Australian Universities were ranked after its investigation of the way Universities check the quality of their work and the outcome of research, teaching and learning and community service.

Professor Fay Gale, UWA Vice-Chancellor said, "We are the top research University in the State and in the Country by a long way, with more research money per capita than anyone else."

and authority to lead and work with the various professionals involved in putting the project together.

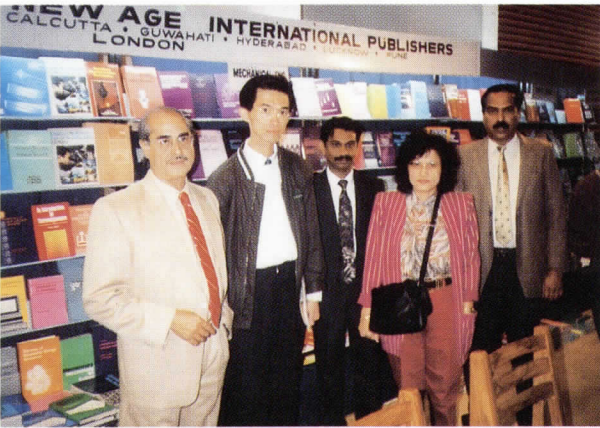

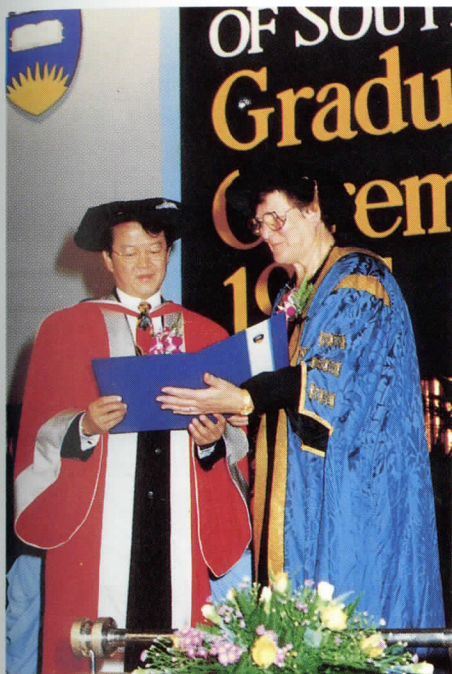


SASA's president, Mrs Lim Tiew Ming said, "We want to be known as caring educators and not only concern ourselves with education and paper qualifications."

Sunway Lagoon Resort Hotel, the forth-coming landmark in the breathtaking Sunway Lagoon Resort, will be completed in 1995. The 19-storey 4-star hotel's unique facade is themed along the Magic Kingdom in Disneyland.

The hotel offers resort-style comfort for its guests, and is within close proximity to the Sunway Theme Park and Sunway Capitol which is expected to be ready in 1996.

The 436 room hotel boasts of a distinctively grand Grand Ballroom. The Ballroom with a 30 feet high ceiling can accommodate up to 2,000 guests and it will be the largest in Klang Valley. The Ballroom comes with state-of-the-art audio visual facilities, built-in stage and pre-function hall suitable for conventions, dinners, exhibitions and stage shows. In addition, the hotel also houses 2

Junior Ballrooms and 14 Meeting cum Function rooms which are catered for smaller private meetings and dinners.

The hotel offers a hosts of sports facilities including 3 tennis courts, 1 swimming pool with poolside bar and BBQ area, 1 themed children pool with water slides, 2 spa pools, gymnasium, aerobics and a themed world's largest surf-wave pool of approximately 13,000 square metre. It will be the first ever man-made surf pool.

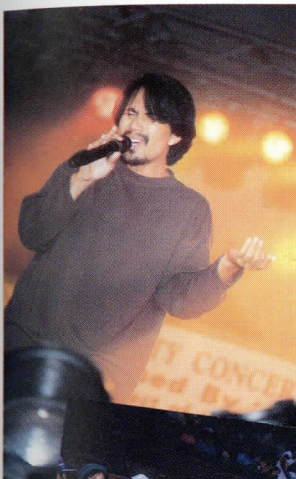

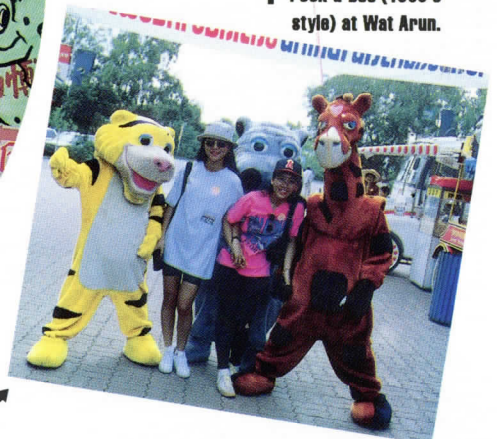

Voices of joy and laughter filled Sunway Lagoon day and night, throughout the recent 7-Up COOL CAMP.

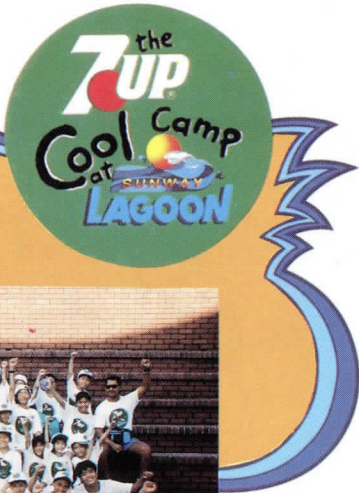
City kids were learning to camp real fun. They were guided by their respective team captains in group names such as Orca, Willy, Moby Dick, Flipper, Piranha and Jaws!

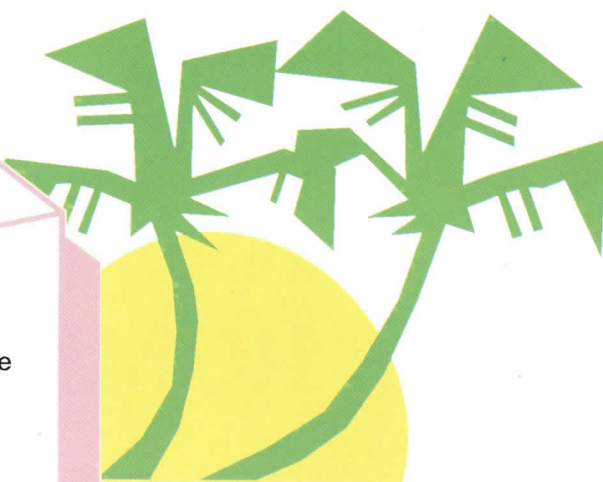

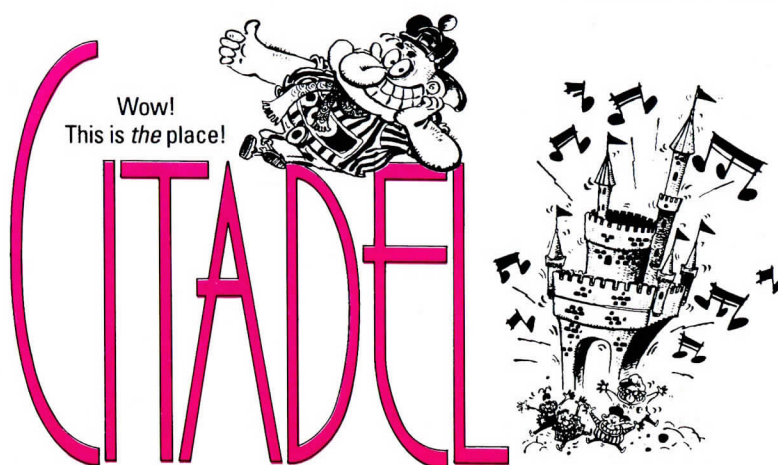

A lifeguard's job is not as easy as sitting around and watching the day pass.

When asked about the qualifications needed to be a lifeguard, Amiludin Mohd Nor, Chief Lifeguard of the Sunway Theme Park said, "One has to be a good swimmer."

A good swimmer, I was soon to find out, is one that is well-equipped with CPR and first-aid knowledge, a scuba diver and a jet-ski rider! In short, a McGyver that can get round the Theme Park!

The 30 lifeguards at Sunway Lagoon Theme Park are trained and retrained everyday. Jimmy Tan, the other Chief Lifeguard who rotates in shifts with Amir, does most of the training.

Monday is swimming day, Wednesday is for CPR, Thursday is reserved for their meeting to thrash out problems, and Friday is their first-aid training. These are done before the park opens at 11 am every morning. For the whole month of July, their agenda is scuba diving training in the wave pool.

Besides these basic trainings, all the lifeguards are also trained to use the equipment in the first-aid room. I discovered that the room is even equipped with an oxygen tank and a spinal injury board.

However, these are only precautionary equipment. Lifeguard, Azman Maarof who has been with the Theme Park since it started operations 2 years ago said, "So far, only minor accidents have happened."

Amir attributed this to the many written warnings and verbal reminders that the lifeguards disseminate to patrons regarding rules and regulations of their rides.

"Isn't your job boring?" I asked. "Definitely not," lifeguard Azman Arif said. "I get to meet different people everyday." "And we are exposed to international community too," Azman Maarof was quick to add.

I almost forgot - the Park had been a popular spot for various shows and international shows, like the Omega Jet-Ski show, International Queen of the Year Pageant, etc.

Besides, the lifeguards get rotated from station to station every hour.
