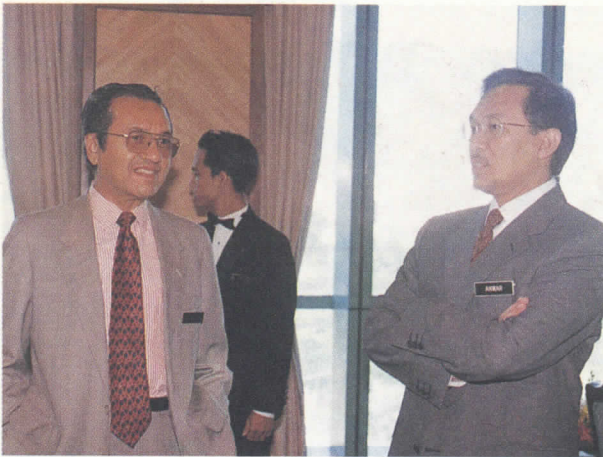

VISION 2020 : THE WAY FORWARD

YAB Dato' Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad, Prime Minister of Malaysia advocated this in the Keynote Address entitled "*Vision 2020 : The Way Forward*" at the Kongress Kebangsaan Wawasan 2020. YAB Prime Minister stressed the need to develop Malaysia economically, politically, socially, spiritually, psychologically and culturally. He further called on the people to play a stronger role to make the Vision a reality. The Congress was not to revise the latter but to discuss how Malaysia can progress as quickly and as productively as possible to the targets set for 2020. All the nine challenges of Vision 2020 were discussed extensively by the delegates and key-players.

The two-day national event was held on 29 - 30 April at Sunway Lagoon Resort Hotel, the official hotel. It was jointly organised by the Prime Minister's Department, Institute of Strategic & International Studies (ISIS) Malaysia and Asian Strategy & Leadership Institute (ASLI), under the auspices of the Malaysian Business Council. The Congress was attended by approximately 750 delegates comprising Cabinet Ministers, State Councillors, leading businessmen, senior government officials and youth leaders.

The highlight of the Congress was the workshop session where recommendations resulting from frank discussions were later presented to the Prime Minister during the Closing Ceremony. Similarly, YAB Prime Minister also held an Open Dialogue session with the attendees before declaring the Congress close.

Sungei Way Construction Berhad (Suncon) was listed on the main board of the Kuala Lumpur Stock Exchange on 12th June.

Sungei Way Construction shares opened trading at RM3.78 for a premium of RM2.28 or 152 per cent over its offer price of RM1.50. At the end of the day's trading, it hit a high of RM4.82 with 20,289 lots traded.

Currently one of the top five infrastructure construction groups in the country, the company has steadily been growing and has RM3.3 billion worth of projects in hand. Out of this 30% are in-house projects.

Sungei Way Construction is currently the main turnkey contractor for two highway privatization projects at a contract value of RM1.58 billion. It plans to participate more aggressively in infrastructure projects in the near future.

With the funds from the public issue of RM71.85 million, the company will be utilizing RM130 million for capital expenditure, repayment of

borrowings and working capital purposes.

The Sungei Way Construction public issue is being underwritten by DCB Sakura Merchant Bankers as the Managing Underwriter, Arab Malaysian Merchant Bank Bhd, HLG Securities Sdn Bhd, Malaysian International Merchant Bank Bhd, Rashid Hussein Securities Sdn Bhd, Smith Zain Securities Sdn Bhd, TA Securities Sdn Bhd and Perwira Affin Merchant Bank Bhd.

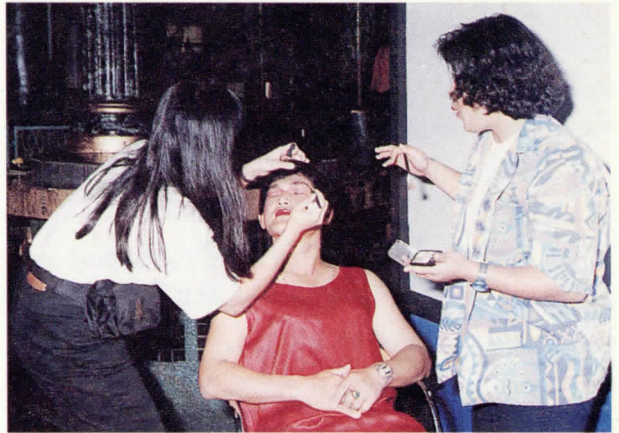
KSS NITE ACT 1

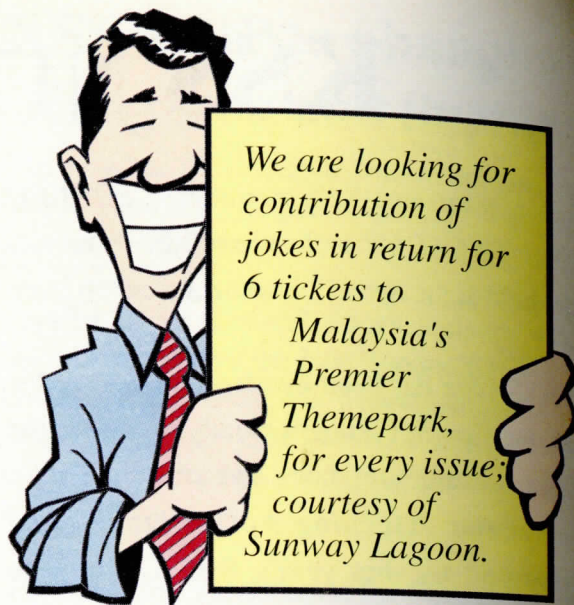
