MONASH SETS UP UNIVERSITY AT BANDAR SUNWAY

The region's youth can now experience Australia's largest university at its first Offshore Branch Campus.

Monash University Sunway Campus Malaysia

With its sterling track record in private higher education, Sunway College was looked upon by the Government as the ideal vehicle to take the next great leap towards realising its aspiration of making Malaysia a regional centre for excellence in education. Aiming to cater to the students from the ASEAN region, the Government initiated the development of its first international branch campus in the country, the establishment of Monash University Sunway Campus Malaysia.

In line with the global trend of bringing the classroom to students, Monash University Sunway Campus Malaysia was formalised on 23 February 1998 with the invitation by our Government to Monash University, to set up its first offshore international branch campus in Malaysia. The letter of invitation to set up the branch campus was presented by our Malaysian Education Minister, YB Dato' Sri Hj Mohd Najib bin Tun Haji Abdul Razak, to YBhg Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Abdul Hamid bin Pawanteh, Chairman of Monash University Sunway Campus Malaysia and Sunway College, and witnessed by HE Mr Robert Cotton, the Australian High Commissioner in Malaysia.



Love Made In Heaven


Ten couples took part in the game of *lurve*...during the preliminary round of the "Love Made In Heaven" game show held on 8 February, at Sunway Pyramid.



Education for Global Competitiveness

In support of Malaysia's vision of becoming the regional centre of educational excellence, a National Education Conference with the theme "Educational for Global Competitiveness" was organised by the Asian Strategy & Leadership Institute (ASLI) on 26 - 27 February 1998 at the Sunway Lagoon Resort Hotel.

Attended by top officials of the Education Ministry, public universities and private education operators, the conference was officiated by YB Dato' Sri Najib Tun Razak, Minister of Education who delivered the keynote address. The Minister stated that a more flexible education and examination system may be introduced in future as Malaysian education is becoming more individual-oriented. The new approach named "Individual Oriented Education" (IOE) will provide a much more decentralised system which goes beyond the standard practice of uniformity. Through the IOE, Malaysia hopes to produce individuals who are more creative, innovative, intellectual, critical as well as able to compete on a global platform. The Minister also explained that the criterias used to determine whether a government scholarship holder abroad should be brought back includes the university the student is studying at, sufficiency of funds and the capacity of local public and private universities to absorb returning students.

Encik Sri Nusa Ahmad Thaharuddin, Deputy Director-General, Private Education Department, Ministry of Education, also addressed the conference.

Encik Sri Nusa Ahmad stated that there is an abundance of opportunities for the Malaysian private education sector to expand. However, private education institutions must ensure that they are able to provide quality education as well as maintain high ethical and professional standards. Likewise, Tan Sri Datuk Dr Wan Mohd. Zahid bin Mohd Noordin, former Director-General of Education/Adviser with Special Functions to the Minister, called on the private education providers to develop a rating system as well as a charter of guarantee to ensure that high standards are maintained at their institutions.

One of the highlights of the conference was the session on "Distant Learning Enhancing Delivery Systems", chaired by Prof. Ian Chubb, Vice-Chancellor, Flinders University. The speakers shared their experiences with the delegates concerning the pros and cons of implementing distant learning.

There was also a special session on "MSC Initiatives for Multimedia Knowledge Workers: Quantitative and Qualitative Issues", conducted by Dr NorSaidatul Akmar Mazelan, Senior Manager - Strategy, Operation and Research, Multimedia Development Corporation (MDC).


Chap Goh Meh at Sunway Lagoon Club

In conjunction with Valentine's Day, Sunway Lagoon Club held a Valentine Cake Decorating Competition.





He added that this is the act of a responsible citizen and it has helped the Police in its day to day administration, especially in the prevention of crime and social responsibilities.


Safe Driving






The 170-metre long beach front, beneath the shimmering stars, is ideal for holding outdoor functions.


After dusk, the whole Lagoon is transformed into a fairyland-like fun place with its wonderful display of lights.


