SUNWAY-PIONEER QUARRY SDN BHD









Datuk Seri Rafidah Aziz, the International Trade and Industry Minister officiated the launch of two quarry and ready-mix

concrete joint venture companies involving the Sungei Way Group and Australian-based Pioneer International Holdings Pty Ltd at the Sunway Lagoon Resort Hotel on 10th June 1999.

Pioneer operates more than 600 concrete plants, 120 quarries and 60 manufacturing plants in 16 countries. It has been established in Europe and Asia for 35 years and in the United States for 20 years. The sales revenue of the Pioneer Group in 1998 was A\$3.6 billion.

SPQ is a 50-50 joint venture between Sungei Way Holdings Bhd, which is the largest quarry and premix operator in Malaysia with 15 quarries and 19 asphalt plants; and Pioneer International. PSC is also a 50-50 joint venture but between Sunway Building Technology Bhd and Pioneer International.

Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Jeffrey Cheah commented at the launce that the joint-venture is indeed timely as the economies of scalar increased efficiency and competitiveness and merger aclientele to enable it to command a dominant position in the respective markets. In fact we shall be market leaders in aggregates, concrete and premix.

According to Datuk Seri Rafidah Aziz, the local construction sector is showing signs of picking up again in tandem with the recovery of the economy. Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Jeffrey agreement added that "In spite of the recent economic problems, the construction industry is expected to be a significant contribute to the nation's gross domestic product."

Finally, Mr Chris Cobb, representative from Pionee International and also Joint CEO of the merged entity, togethe with Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Jeffrey thanked Datuk Seri Rafidah for her kind presence and also for unveiling the new corporate log for the Joint-Venture Companies.





lalaysian Students Start "Yo Yo"

Four pioneer students of Monash University, Malaysia, established an electronic communication network using high capacity hardware, a general access UNIX server and a communication connection, provided by the University.

The server, named "YoYo", is modeled after a similar system used by students in Monash, Australia. It is developed and maintained by the four pioneer students - Adrian Lo, Derrick Tan, Wong Kok Leong and Myles Milston, who later formed the Monash UNIX Group. The purpose, to provide students with their own avenue for general internet services from e-mail and storage space on the server to tutorials on computer related topics and relay chats.

According to Professor Robin Pollard, Head of School of Business and Information Technology, there was no formal instruction for the project. "Enthusiasm combined with knowledge gained in first-year computer science subjects were enough to get started. This is consistent with our philosophy of providing education that enables one to learn by oneself," he said.

#### Monash Students Set Up Council

A temporary student council has been established to represent the voices of the student community in Monash University, Malaysia. Called the Pro-Temp Council, the body was established with 20 pioneer students.

The establishment of this council shows that Monash students are interested in forging their own identity. They are willing to take the opportunity to establish a democratic constitution for the student organisation that will eventually become part of the Monash University Federation of Student Organizations (MUFSO).

Pro Vice-Chancellor, Professor James Warren said that MUFSO is a body that connects all student organisations on each of the Monash campuses and through this council, the University expects its students to share the learning experience of Monash University in Malaysia.

The Pro-Temp Council is organising activities for the students to encourage inter-faculty interaction that will enhance the collegiate environment at the University. At the same time, they are also organising an election campaign for the first official student council of Monash University, Malaysia.

### LAUNCHING OF SKATE ASIA '99



SUNGEIWAY HOLDINGS BERHAD AGM

The company had successfully forged an alliance with Pioneer International Holdings Property Limited, an Australian based multinational company.

In the 1998 financial year, SungeiWay incurred a group pre-tax loss of RM148.5 million while the group's turnover was RM761.5 million.

SUNGEIWAY CONSTRUCTION BERHAD AGM

Sungei Way Construction Berhad has been awarded three contracts worth more than RM60 million. The first project with work commencing in July is a RM14.7 million construction management service for the proposed Zanadu Leisure, a retail and hospitality project in Kaohsiung, Taiwan.

The second contract involves the construction of 1,132 units of medium-low cost apartments and ancillary facilities at Bandar Baru Puncak Alam. Work on this RM35.3 million project is expected to begin in August this year and to be completed by March 2001.

The third contract worth RM15.3 million is for the construction of 560 units of low-cost flats at Bandar Mahkota, Cheras. Work is expected to begin in June this year.

Sunway Building Technology (Suntec) had taken all necessary steps to position the company to face the current year. Suntec posted a group pre-tax loss of RM85 million last year.

Suntec Chairman Encik Mirzan Mahathir said, the company whose core business is construction, is leaner and more effective now. It is nevertheless cautiously optimistic as there are signs that the property sector is beginning to pick up.

## SUNWAY CITY BERHAD AGM



Sunway City Berhad Chairman, Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Jeffrey Cheah said property development would be the company's core business. He said, there had been ten times more registration, than the number of units available, for its 500 double-storey link houses in its soon-to-be-launched Sunway Bayan development in Penang. The project has a total sales value of about RM200 million.

There are plans to revive and reconfigure the stalled Sunway Carnival shopping centre in Seberang Jaya. Similar efforts are also planned for the 1,200-acre Sunway City Ipoh. On the Sunway Lagoon Theme Park, Tan Sri Jeffrey said there would be new attractions. The Sunway Lagoon Resort Hotel and Sunway Hotel Penang have been enjoying an average occupancy rate of about 50% to 60%.

The company achieved a turnover of RM410.1 million in 1998, 35% higher than 1997. However, it recorded a consolidated operating loss after tax and minority interest of RM82.57 million.
