

# Transitions: From School to College





# RESEARCHING FOR

# RESEARCHING is a fundamental skill in college life.

You WILL be doing lots of research assignments in college. university, and in life! One thing to note: Academic Research is many things, but it is NOT copypasta-ing Wikipedia articles! You must use properly accredited and scholarly resources, and note them down properly. "Source - ME!" is not acceptable, neither is "My lecturer said so" - however if your lecturer did write a book or article that you use, feel free to cite them in whichever style you are using for your essay.




It's very important to plan your research. Randomly looking around the internet is a great way to get distracted and waste time. You'll most likely be on facebook or 9gag or youtube within 20 minutes of doing 'research'. Write down the key information you need to know, and where you're going to get it. If it's a research assignment, break up the question into smaller subtopics, so you can narrow the focus (hint: typing out your entire question verbatim will not work, as everybody else is going to be doing this) of your research.

You should plan to get references from multiple sources, so try to get sources from books (library) as well as online articles and journals. Plan a timetable too! You cannot do all your research in a single day, or you will have a badly-researched paper.

# LIBRARY RESEARCH

You do remember where the library is, right? Once you get there, find a workspace that is quiet enough for you to think and spacious enough to spread your work out.

Familiarise yourself with the library's layout and sorting before beginning. If you need help you can ask the librarian, but it will go much faster (and you can get out guicker) if you know how to search for books yourself. There will be a sorting system and a computer terminal to help you look for specific topics or books. Use it!

When you have several books ready, start looking through the content pages for potentially useful sections. You don't need to read the entire book to reference it! Learn to skim text for key words. It should not take you more than a few minutes to skim a section. If a section does not look usable for your project, move on to the next. If it does seem good, then read it more in depth and UNDERSTAND what it says.

Reading through reference books and understanding their concepts is a form of studying, and WILL help in your exams! If it's a borrowed book, highlighting is out of the question, so photocopy the relevant information you need. It is also VERY IMPORTANT to note the title, author, publication date and publisher of the book, as well as page numbers of material you are using (although the page numbers should be on your photocopies) for citation purposes. Once you have several references and citations for each subtopic that answers the question, you're done! If you feel the need to read more, you should borrow one or two key books to refer to at home.



# **ONLINE RESEARCH**

The college student has never been more blessed and cursed than by the CTRL-C and CTRL-V keys. Stay away from these! You should VERY RARELY copy a sentence (or even worse, a paragraph) directly into your essay. Learn to paraphrase.

When looking online, there are vast amounts of knowledge at your fingertips. Unfortunately there are also vast amounts of rubbish, so it is a dangerous prospect. Be sure to use only verified trusted sources, such as scholarly articles and peer-reviewed journals. Check with your college as they probably will provide some access to paid online scholarly works for you such as LexisNexis. You may be able to find some free article access out there as well, but make sure the site is legit and not just someone's blog. Note down the URL of the website you visit as well as the date you accessed it for citation purposes. News sources such as Reuters or Associated Press are generally considered acceptable. Citing scholarly articles and peer-reviewed journals is similar to citing physical books, by the way. Check your style guide to make sure you're doing it right.

# CITATIONS, REFERENCES, AND PLAGIARISM

Proper referencing and citation is of UTMOST importance. If you do not properly reference you can be guilty of plagiarism. Plagiarism in many institutions can result in anything from failing the subject to being expelled! Luckily, many colleges use verification tools to assist students in this, such as Turnitin. Check carefully with your lecturer to avoid being accused of plagiarism!

How you actually cite and reference depends on which style you choose, or your college chooses for you. You may have a choice, or be limited to one or more styles. Get familiar with them! There are many, but some of the most common include MLP, APA, or Harvard. Ask your lecturers for help in learning these methods, or find out how to do them online and follow them TO THE LETTER.

WRAPPING UP

If you do have a choice, it is completely up to you as to which you choose. Choose one that you feel comfortable with. Some styles use in-text citations, some use footnotes, and bibliography/reference sections can differ as well.




Once you've written your essay/project, be sure that you check through your citations and references, making sure that proper credit is given for each case. If you have conducted your planning phase well, this should be very easy. The important thing is to be organised, or you may lose track of your references and end up being accused of plagiarism (this is a bad thing).


