This is something close to the heart of our Vice Chancellor, Professor Robert Bignall. Let us hear more on what he has to share:

Q: What does it mean to be a First Class University?

First class universities attract good students because they offer academic programmes that are challenging, up to date and interesting. First class universities maintain high academic standards and so serve as a benchmark for other universities. They are also known for the quality of their academic staff and for their ability to produce cutting edge research that advances knowledge.

Another important attribute of a first class university is that the degrees they offer are taught by the academic staff that developed those degrees. Sunway has set itself on the path to becoming a world class university by ensuring that all of the degrees that we have developed meet the rigorous academic standards set by a high ranking and internationally recognised institution, namely Lancaster University. We are the only Malaysian university that benchmarks its degrees in this way.

Q: What do you foresee to be the challenges in achieving First Class status?

A first class university has outstanding academic staff, including senior professors who are known and respected internationally by their peers in their discipline area. Sun-U has managed to attract some very good staff, but we now need to appoint more full professors, who can provide high level academic leadership in those discipline areas where we have strong academic programmes.

Senior professors are necessary, not just to provide great teaching, but to help us ensure that our degrees reflect the latest and most up-to-date knowledge.

Q: What are the attributes of a First Class University student/graduate?

Graduates from a first class university are confident, well-rounded, have strong written and spoken communication skills, are able to think critically and are lifelong learners. They have an enthusiasm for ideas and for learning new things, not just in the areas that they have studied but in other areas as well.

Q: With regards to careers & employability, how should Sun-U graduates stand out from the rest?

We have made sure that all of our degree programmes are geared to developing good communication skills and the habit of independent learning. For this reason we have included study skills and communication skills as an explicit part of the undergraduate curriculum. We also encourage all of our students to develop leadership skills.

Q: What is your advice to students in starting the year right as we begin 2011?

Focus on developing independent study skills. Learn to use the library facilities, especially the on-line catalogues and databases, so that you become efficient in finding the information you need for assignments etc. At the same time, get involved in the social life of the campus, so that you get to know your fellow students and enjoy the many benefits in terms of personal development that come from being a student at a vibrant university. Join some clubs, and perhaps even stand for election to the Student Council.

Marketing Vs Sales

WARKETING

- Marketing is the function of creating awareness and promoting your product by reaching your targeted prospects effectively.
 In general the marketing process covers:
 - i. Discovering what product customers want
 - ii. Producing a product with the appropriate features
 - iii. Pricing the product correctly
 - iv. Promoting the product
- As such marketing means generating sales prospects. Once the product is out in the market, it is the task of the sales person to influence the customer to buy it.
- Marketing is aimed at longer terms for example, building the brand name and winning customers.
- Marketing consists mainly of branding, advertising, public relations, viral marketing and direct marketing.
- Putting it simply, a good job in Marketing will lead to sales.

SALES

- Eventually when customers buy the product, then the company makes Sales.
- Sales involves more interpersonal interaction whilst Marketing reaches out to the masses. Sales attempts to engage the prospect on a personal level rather than at a distance.
- A sales person's objective is to convince or influence the customer to buy. He desires to sell as quickly as possible to fulfill sales volume objectives.
- Sales is focused on meeting consumer demand, attempting to make consumer demand match the products it has, whereas Marketing revolves around research and promotional activities to find out what products are desired by customers and to make potential customers aware of them.

MUST HAVE

- Any degree in Business & Commerce. A major in Marketing could be an advantage.
- For a career in Sales, having a high EQ (emotional quotient) and excellent interpersonal skills will put you above others.

- 3. Join an entrepreneur club or get involved in business networking.

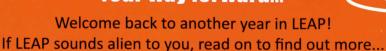
