Sunway University soars to #81 in THE Impact Rankings 2025 17 June 2025



We are proud to announce that Sunway University ranks among the world's top universities in advancing the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in 2025.

Sunway University has achieved a landmark global ranking of #81 out of 2,318 universities in the Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Rankings 2025, a dramatic rise from last year's 201–300 band. This position placed the University firmly among the world's leading institutions, driving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The 2025 edition is the most competitive to date, with over 2,300 participating institutions. The University's rise is one of the most notable leaps globally and reflects the university's whole-of-institution commitment to sustainability, societal responsibility, and global engagement.

This year, Sunway University submitted data for six SDGs and was ranked in the global Top 100 for all six, including five in the Top 50 and two in the Top 25:

- SDG 8: Decent Work and Economic Growth #20
- SDG 17: Partnerships for the Goals #22
- SDG 7: Affordable and Clean Energy #31
- SDG 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities #30
- SDG 6: Clean Water and Sanitation #50
- SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Production #78

Prof. Dr Sibrandes Poppema, President of Sunway University, commended the achievement as a major institutional milestone:

"This ranking reflects the deep integration of sustainability into our university's DNA. It is the result of a collective vision that was shared by our students, academics, and partners to build a future where education drives meaningful impact. I'm immensely proud of our progress and even more inspired by what lies ahead."

The THE Impact Rankings are the only global performance tables that assess universities against the full range of the SDGs, using a unique methodology that evaluates research output, stewardship, outreach, and teaching.

Sunway University's performance highlights the success of targeted initiatives such as the Campus With A Conscience movement, expanding global partnerships, and its growing reputation as a sustainability-driven, innovation-led institution.

"This recognition encourages us to go further," added Prof. Poppema. "We are not only committed to climbing rankings but also committed to transforming lives, societies, and the planet through our academic mission."

Sunway University's Desa Mentari Project featured in The Sun 17 June 2025



When Professor Dr Mahendhiran Sanggaran Nair, currently Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Research and Sustainability) at Sunway University, first visited the Desa Mentari flats known as Project Perumahan Rakyat (PPR), occupied by residents from the B-40 community, his first thoughts were to transform the community through student-led initiatives.

Over three years, from 2022, the public housing scheme, located along the Federal Highway in Klang Valley, has been part of a community initiative led by 1,800 Sunway University students. They are supported by the Tan Sri Sir Dr Jeffrey Cheah Foundation. Community service has also successfully been embedded into the course curriculum for the university.

"The Sunway students are privileged to receive a good education. However, I believe with privilege comes responsibility, and with their education and opportunities, they too can make a difference in improving the lives of vulnerable and disadvantaged communities, especially when they are located so close to Sunway University," he said.

Fast forward to 2025, the Sunway Desa Mentari Community Development Programme today has helped transform the community of more than 26,000 residents, where households earn less than RM5,000, into resilient communities through various youth skills development programmes.

Plans for equipping children and youth with ICT skills, financial literacy, language communication, culinary arts and food safety, basic coding and AI literacy will ensure their confidence and self-esteem improve with time.

Using the UK's National Health System (NHS) as a case study, Professor Watts illustrated effective strategies to reduce the medical field's carbon footprint.



Renowned for his work in establishing Net Zero Healthcare Systems, Professor Watts encouraged the audience to reimagine medicine not only as a practice of healing people but also as a powerful avenue to protect our planet.



The session ignited thoughtful dialogue among students, academics, and healthcare professionals, further affirming FMLS's dedication to cultivating a new generation of environmentally conscious and future-ready medical leaders.
